
**Nonfarm Job Losses Exceed Historic Average Loss;  
Arizona Unemployment Rate Drops to 5.8%**

Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped an additional two-tenths of a percentage point from 6.0% in April to 5.8% in May. This is the third month in a row that Arizona's unemployment rate has fallen by at least two-tenths of a percent. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased one-tenth of a percentage point from 5.4% in April to 5.5% in May. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 6.9% and the U.S. rate was 6.3% (see **Figure 1**).

**Over the Month**

Arizona shed 10,500 Nonfarm jobs (-0.4%) in May (see **Figure 2**). This was more than both the post-recessionary ('10-'14) average loss of 2,500 jobs and the ten-year ('05-'14) average loss of 1,900 jobs. The Private Sector added 1,700 jobs and Government shed 12,200 jobs. The majority of losses in Government were seasonal losses reported in State (-9,100 jobs) and Local (-4,400 jobs) Education. Five of the eleven major sectors added jobs and six reported losses. The largest gain was in Professional & Business Services which added 2,600 jobs. Gains were also reported in Education & Health Services (1,100 jobs), Manufacturing (900 jobs), Financial Activities (800 jobs), and Construction (700 jobs). Sectors which reported losses include Government (-12,200 jobs), Leisure & Hospitality (-2,500 jobs), Trade, Transportation & Utilities (-1,100 jobs), Information (-500 jobs), Other Services


(-200 jobs), and Natural Resources & Mining (-100 jobs).

### Over the Year

Arizona Nonfarm employment grew by 2.4% (61,100 jobs) over the year in May (see **Figure 3**). The Private Sector accounted for most of the gains adding 57,800 jobs. Government added the remaining 3,300 jobs over the year. Eight of the eleven major sectors reported job gains and three reported losses. The sectors with the largest gains included Professional and Business Services (16,100 jobs) and Education & Health Services (14,300 jobs). Other gains were reported in Leisure & Hospitality (9,000 jobs), Other Services (6,600 jobs), Trade, Transportation & Utilities (5,300 jobs), Financial Activities (5,000 jobs), Government (3,300 jobs), and Construction (2,600 jobs). Over-the-year job losses were reported in Manufacturing (-600 jobs), Natural Resources & Mining (-300 jobs), and Information (-200 jobs).



Over-the-Year Job Gain/Loss by Sector



**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change**



**Arizona & U.S. Construction Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change**






**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change**
