Below Average Nonfarm Job Gains; Unemployment Rate Drops to 6.9%

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped four-tenths of a percentage point from 7.3% in March to 6.9% in April. This was the largest over-the-month drop reported since September 1983 and the first time the unemployment rate has dropped below 7.0% since August of 2008. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also decreased four-tenths of a percentage point from 6.7% in March to 6.3% in April. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0% and the U.S. rate was 7.5% (see **Figure 1**).


In April, 4,300 Nonfarm jobs (0.2%) were added to the payroll in Arizona (see **Figure 2**). Small job gains are typical in April. These Nonfarm job gains were lower than the post recessionary ('10-'13) average gain of 7,600 jobs and the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 4,800 jobs. Gains in Government (1,100 jobs) were below the post recessionary ('10-'13)

average (1,700 jobs) as well as the ten-year ('04-'13) average (1,200 jobs). The Private Sector added the majority of Nonfarm gains (3,200 jobs), but fell short of its ten year ('04-'13) average gain of 3,600 jobs. The post recessionary ('10-'13) average gain for the Private Sector was 5,800 jobs.

Over the Month by Industry Sector

Eight of the eleven major sectors added jobs and three reported losses (see **Figure 3**). Leisure and Hospitality (1,500 jobs) and Other Services (1,200 jobs) sectors recorded the largest over-the-month employment gains. Construction (-1,100 jobs) recorded the largest employment loss.

Leisure and Hospitality added 1,500 jobs (0.5%) over the month. This job gain was smaller than the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,900 jobs. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation gained 1,100 jobs, more than the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 600 jobs. Accommodation

recorded its largest April job loss (-1,100 jobs) and the first April loss since 2007. Historically ('04-'13), Accommodation has averaged a job gain of 500 jobs. Food Services gained 1,500 jobs, more than the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 800 jobs.


Other Services recorded the second largest job gain, adding 1,200 jobs (1.4%) over the month. Historically ('04-'13), Other Services averages job losses during April (-800 jobs).

Government added 1,100 jobs (0.3%) in April, similar to its ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,200 jobs. Gains were recorded in Federal (700 jobs) and Local Government (400 jobs) while State Government remained unchanged.

Professional and Business Services (PBS) gained 1,000 jobs (0.3%) over the month, less than the average ten-year ('04-'13) gain of 1,600 jobs. Gains in PBS were recorded in Administrative and Support and Waste Services (1,100 jobs), and Management of Companies and Enterprises (200 jobs), while Professional, Scientific and Technical Services lost 300 jobs. Within Administrative and Support and Waste, Employment Services gained 1,000 jobs, Services to Buildings and Dwellings gained 300 jobs and Business Support Services remained flat.

Financial Activities gained 800 jobs (0.4%) in April, twice its ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 400 jobs. Finance and Insurance added 600 jobs and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 200 jobs. All gains in Finance and Insurance were from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (1,000 jobs), which recorded its largest over-the-month April gain on record (1990-2014). Credit Intermediation and Related Activities lost 400 jobs, while Securities, Commodity Contracts was flat.

Education and Health Services (EHS) added 200 jobs in April (0.1%), below its ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 900 jobs. Both, **Information** and **Natural Resources and Mining** added 100 jobs each.

Construction recorded the largest over-the-month loss, shedding 1,100 jobs (-0.9%). Construction losses in April are not typical and have not occurred since 2009. Specialty Trades has historically ('04-'13) averaged a gain of 600 jobs, but recorded a loss of 1,200 jobs in April. Building Construction lost 100 jobs and Heavy Construction gained 200 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities lost 500 jobs (-0.1%) in April, equal to its average ten-year ('04-'13) loss. Trade overall had a net loss of 500 jobs. Losses were observed in Retail Trade (-200 jobs). Losses within Retail Trade were from Motor Vehicles and Parts (-200 jobs) and Building Materials and Garden Supply (-100 jobs). Clothing and Accessories (100 jobs) and General Merchandise (300 jobs) gained jobs within Retail Trade. Wholesale Trade lost 300 jobs over the month, slightly below its ten-year ('04-'13) average job loss. Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities

remained flat.

Manufacturing lost 100 jobs over the month, less than its average ten-year ('04-'13) loss of 300 jobs.

Over the Year

Over the year, 44,100 Nonfarm jobs (1.7%) were added in Arizona. The Private Sector accounted for all of these gains adding 46,300 jobs (2.2%). Government shed 2,200 jobs (-0.5%) with only State Education adding jobs. Nine of the eleven major sectors added jobs and two reported losses.

Education and Health Services reported the largest gain of 12,200 jobs (3.3%) over the year. Health Care added 6,200 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (3,900 jobs), Hospitals (1,700 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (600 jobs). Social Assistance added 2,500 jobs growing by 5.9% over the year. This was the sixth month of over-the-year growth over 5.0% for Social Assistance. Educational Services added the remaining 3,500 jobs.


Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 9,600 jobs (2.0%) over the year. Wholesale Trade added 1,900 jobs and Retail Trade added 6,800 jobs. Within Retail Trade, Motor Vehicles and Parts (1,600 jobs), General Merchandise (1,400 jobs), Food and Beverage (1,300 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (600 jobs), and Building Material, Garden Supply (600 jobs) added jobs. Clothing and Accessories lost 1,000 jobs. This was the 24th month of over-the-year growth over 4.0% in Motor Vehicles and Parts. Within Transportation, Warehousing & Utilities, gains in Transportation and Warehousing (1,100 jobs) were slightly offset by losses in Utilities (-200 jobs).

Financial Activities added 8,700 jobs growing by 4.8% over the year. This was the thirteenth month of over-the-year growth above 4.0%. Finance and Insurance added 6,500 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (5,000 jobs). Securities, Commodity Contracts (800 jobs), and Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (700 jobs) also added jobs. The over-the-year gain in Insurance Carriers and Related Activities was the highest on record (1990-2014). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 2,200 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality (L&H) gained 7,400 jobs (2.6%) over the year. Accommodations and Food Services added 5,300 jobs, all from Food Services and Drinking Places (5,600 jobs). Accommodations lost 300 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 2,100 jobs, the largest over-the-year gain in 18 months.

Professional and Business Services added 6,500 jobs (1.7%) over the year. Administrative and Waste Services added 10,200 jobs from Employment Services (6,800 jobs), Business Support Services (3,100 jobs), and Services to Building and Dwellings (300 jobs). Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (-3,100 jobs) and Management of

Companies and Enterprises (-600 jobs) both shed jobs. These were the largest over-the-year losses in both subsectors since 2010.

Construction gained 1,200 jobs (1.0%) over the year. Specialty Trade added 1,800 jobs (2.2%), falling below an over-the-year growth rate of 3.0% for the first time in 27 months. Heavy Construction added 1,000 jobs and Building Construction shed 1,600 jobs.

Other sectors which added jobs over the year include **Other Services** (400 jobs, 0.5%), **Information** (300 jobs, 0.7%), and **Natural Resources and Mining** (200 jobs, 1.5%).

Government shed 2,200 jobs (-0.5%) over the year. State Government added 1,300 jobs, all of which were from State Education (1,300 jobs). Most of the losses in Local Government (-2,400 jobs) were from non-education related sectors (-1,900 jobs). The Federal Government shed 1,100 jobs.

Manufacturing lost 200 jobs (-0.1%) over the year with losses in Durable Goods (-1,300 jobs) offsetting gains in Nondurable Goods (1,100 jobs).

Summary


Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped four-tenths of a percent from 7.3% in March to 6.9% in April. This was the largest over-the-month drop reported since September 1983 and the first time the unemployment rate has dropped below 7.0% since August of 2008. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also dropped four-tenths of a percent from 6.7% in March to 6.3% in April. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0%, and the U.S. rate was 7.5%.

Arizona added 4,300 Nonfarm jobs (0.2%) over the month in April. This was slightly below the ten-year ('04-'13) average job gain of 4,800 jobs and considerably below the post recessionary ('10-'13) average gain of 7,600 jobs. Both the Private Sector (3,200, 0.3%) and Government (1,100, 0.3%) added jobs, lower than the ten-year ('04-'13) average job gain of 3,600 jobs and 1,200 jobs respectively. These gains were also below the post-recessionary ('10-'13) average gains of 5,800 jobs for the Private Sector and 1,700 jobs for the Government. Eight of the eleven major sectors added jobs and three reported losses. The largest gain was observed in Leisure and Hospitality which added 1,500 jobs, lower than the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,900 jobs. The smaller gain can be attributed to losses in Accommodation (-1,100 jobs) which recorded its largest April loss and the first April loss since 2007. Other Services added 1,200 jobs, atypical for April as this sector has averaged a loss of 800 jobs over ten years ('04-'13). Government added 1,100 jobs, slightly below the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,200 jobs. Professional and Business Services added 1,000 jobs followed by Financial Activities (800 jobs). Other sectors with small gains were Education and Health Services (200 jobs), Information (100 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs). Construction lost 1,100 jobs, the largest loss among sectors. This was the first April loss since 2009. Construction has averaged a gain of 600 jobs over ten years ('04-'13). Other sectors with job losses include Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-500 jobs) and Manufacturing (-100 jobs).


Over the year, Arizona's Nonfarm employment increased by 44,100 jobs (1.7%) in April. Gains were all from the Private Sector which added 46,300 jobs (2.2%). Government shed 2,200 jobs (-0.5%). Nine of the eleven major sectors added jobs and two reported losses. Education and Health Services reported the largest over-the-year gain of 12,200 jobs, most of which came from Health Care and Social Assistance which added 8,700 jobs. Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 9,600 jobs. Financial Activities added 8,700 jobs experiencing over-the-year growth of 4.8%. Other gains include Leisure and Hospitality (7,400 jobs), Professional and Business Services (6,500 jobs), Construction (1,200 jobs), Other Services (400 jobs), Information (300 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (200 jobs). Government shed 2,200 jobs followed by Manufacturing which lost 200 jobs.


**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change**






**Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
