Nonfarm Job Gains below Historic Average; Unemployment Rate Edged up to 7.1%

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona edged up one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.0% in July to 7.1% in August. This is the third consecutive month of increase in the unemployment rate. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point from 6.2% in July to 6.1% in August. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.2% (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona added 39,500 Nonfarm jobs (1.6%) in August, a smaller gain compared to the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 43,600 jobs and ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 40,800 jobs (see **Figure 2**). Government (29,400 jobs) accounted for the majority of the job gains. These job gains were seasonal and were primarily in Local Education (29,100 jobs). The Private Sector also reported gains (10,100 jobs), but below the ('09-'13) post-recession (11,800 jobs) and ('04-'13) ten-year average gain (11,700 jobs).



Over the Month by Industry Sector


Seven of the eleven major sectors reported job gains with four reporting losses (see **Figure 3**).

Government added the most with 29,400 jobs added in August (8.1%). This gain was less than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 31,800 jobs. Local Government added the most (26,200 jobs), all of which came from Local Education (29,100 jobs). State Government added 3,000 jobs of which 2,900 jobs were from State Education. Federal Government added the remaining 200 jobs.

Education and Health Services added 6,100 jobs (1.6%), below the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 7,600 jobs. Health Care and Social Assistance added 4,100 jobs, the largest over-the-month gain on record ('90-'14). Health Care added 2,400 jobs and Social Assistance added 1,700 jobs, larger than their post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 1,300 jobs

and 1,100 jobs respectively. Within Health Care, Ambulatory Health Care Services (1,300 jobs), Hospitals (600 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (500 jobs) added jobs. Educational Services added 2,000 jobs, far below the post-recessionary-average gain of 5,200 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality added 1,900 jobs (0.7%), less than the average post-recessionary gain of 3,000 jobs. Accommodation and Food Services added 2,000 jobs overall. Food Services and Drinking Places added 1,700 jobs and Accommodation added 300 jobs. Gains in Food Services and Drinking Places were below the average post-recessionary gain of 3,300 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation reported a small loss of 100 jobs.



Professional and Business Services gained 1,800 jobs (0.5%), slightly higher than the post-recessionary average gain of 1,100 jobs.

Administrative and Support and Waste added 2,100 jobs from Employment Services (1,500 jobs), Services to Buildings and Dwellings (900 jobs), and Business Support Services (400 jobs). The unreported sectors within Administrative and Support and Waste lost 700 jobs. Management of Companies and Enterprises was flat over the month and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services shed 300 jobs.

Financial Activities added 900 jobs. Gains in Finance and Insurance (1,300 jobs) were slightly offset by losses in Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (-400 jobs). Within Finance and Insurance, Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (700 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (500 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (100 jobs) all reported gains.

Construction and **Natural Resources and Mining** gained 100 jobs each.

Information shed 300 jobs followed by **Other Services** which lost 200 jobs.

Manufacturing shed 200 jobs with gains in Nondurable Goods (100 jobs) being offset by losses in Durable Goods (-300 jobs).

Trade, Transportation and Utilities lost 100 jobs, unusual for the month of August which has reported only three other losses. Trade, Transportation and Utilities has a ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,000. Wholesale Trade added 300 jobs and Retail Trade lost 200 jobs. Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities shed 200 jobs.


Over the Year

Arizona added 51,400 Nonfarm jobs over the year (2.1%). The majority of gains were reported in the Private Sector (50,500 jobs or 2.4%). Government added the remaining 900 jobs (0.2%). Nine of the eleven major sectors reported gains with two sectors reporting losses (see **Figure 4**).

Education and Health Services reported the largest gain with 17,800 jobs over the year (4.8%). Health Care added 10,800 jobs, the highest over-the-year gain since December 2008. Within Health Care, Ambulatory Health Care Services (7,100 jobs), Hospitals (2,700 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (1,000 jobs) added jobs. Social Assistance added 4,000 jobs, the largest over-the-year gain recorded ('90-'14). Educational Services added 3,000 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality added 10,000 jobs over the year (3.7%). The majority of gains were driven by Accommodation and Food Services (7,500 jobs) of which 6,800 jobs were from Food Services and Drinking Places and 700 jobs were from Accommodation. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 2,500 jobs.

Financial Activities gained 8,400 jobs (or 4.5%), marking the 17th consecutive month of over-the-year gains above 4.0%. Finance and Insurance added 7,000 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (4,300 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,800 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (900 jobs). Insurance Carriers and Related Activities has now reported an over the year growth above 9.0 % for ten months. Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 1,400 jobs.



Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 6,200 jobs (1.3%). Trade added 5,800 jobs from Retail Trade (4,400 jobs) and Wholesale Trade (1,400 jobs). Within Retail Trade, Food and Beverage (1,200 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (900 jobs), Motor Vehicles and Parts (700 jobs), General Merchandise (500 jobs), and Building Material, Garden Supply (100 jobs) gained jobs. Clothing and Accessories shed 800 jobs. The gain in Motor Vehicle and Parts was the smallest reported since October 2010. It was also the first time since October 2010 that growth in this sector has not been above 2.0%. Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities added 400 jobs. Transportation and Warehousing added 700 jobs and Utilities shed 300 jobs.

Other Services gained 2,300 jobs (2.7%).

Government added 900 jobs (0.2%). Both State (1,600 jobs) and Local (100 jobs) Government reported gains with Federal Government reporting a loss of 800 jobs.

Manufacturing gained 400 jobs, all from Nondurable Goods (700 jobs). Durable goods

shed 300 jobs.

Natural Resources and Mining added 100 jobs.

Construction shed 6,600 jobs (-5.2%). This was the fourth consecutive month of over the year losses. Gains in Heavy Construction (800 jobs) were offset by losses in Specialty Trade (-3,800 jobs) and Construction of Buildings (-3,600 jobs).

Information shed 200 jobs.

Summary


The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona edged up one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.0% in July to 7.1% in August. This is the third consecutive month of increase in unemployment rate. On the other hand, the U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped one-tenth of a percentage point from 6.2% in July to 6.1% in August. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.2%. Arizona added 39,500 Nonfarm jobs (1.6%) in August. These were primarily seasonal gains within Government (29,400 jobs) from Local (29,100 jobs) Education. Total Nonfarm job gains were below the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 43,600 jobs and ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 40,800 jobs. The Private Sector reported a gain of 10,100 jobs, below the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 11,800 jobs and ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 11,700 jobs.

Seven of the eleven major sectors reported job gains and four reported losses over the month. Government recorded the largest over-the-month gain with 29,400 jobs, slightly below the post recession ('09-'13) average gain of 31,800 jobs. Education and Health Services added 6,100 jobs, less than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 7,600 jobs. Other sectors to report job gains were Leisure and Hospitality (1,900 jobs), Professional and Business Services (1,800 jobs), Financial Activities (900 jobs), Construction (100 jobs), and Natural Resource and Mining (100 jobs). Sectors with reported losses include, Information (-300 jobs), Other Services (-200 jobs), Manufacturing (-200 jobs), and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (-100 jobs).


Over the year, Arizona added 51,400 Nonfarm jobs (2.1%). The Private Sector gained 50,500 jobs (2.4%) and Government added only 900 jobs (0.2%) over the year. Nine of the eleven major sectors reported gains and two reported losses. Among the top gainers were Education and Health Services that added 17,800 jobs. The majority of these gains were in Health Care which has reported the highest over-the-year gains since December 2008. It was followed by Leisure and Hospitality (10,000 jobs), Financial Activities (8,400 jobs), and Trade, Transportation and Utilities (6,200 jobs). Other sectors with smaller gains include Other Services (2,300 jobs), Government (900 jobs), Manufacturing (400 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs). Construction reported the fourth consecutive over-the-year loss of 6,600 jobs in August. Information shed 200 jobs.


Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate Seasonally Adjusted




Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change



Arizona & U.S. Construction Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change





Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change
