**Private Sector Job Gains Offset by Seasonal Losses in Government;  
Unemployment Rate at 7.6%**

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped two-tenths of a percentage point from 7.8% in November to 7.6% in December, the lowest unemployment rate since October 2008. The U.S. unemployment rate dropped three-tenths of a percentage point from 7.0% in November to 6.7% in December. A year ago the Arizona rate was 7.9% and the U.S. rate was also 7.9% (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona gained 6,900 Nonfarm jobs (0.3%) in December (see **Figure 2**). Over-the-month gains are typical in December, which has recorded only two losses since 1990 (1990 and 2008). The December job gain was slightly above the ten-year ('03-'12) average (6,700 jobs) and above the post-recessionary ('09-'12) average (3,600 jobs) gains. The Private Sector accounted for all employment



gains in December, adding 11,100 jobs (0.5%). Government lost 4,200 jobs, with losses occurring within State Education (-2,600 jobs) and Local Education (-2,500 jobs). Seasonal job losses in Government are typical in December as schools break for the holidays.

**Over the Month by Industry Sector**

Seven of the eleven major sectors added jobs, three lost jobs and one remained unchanged in December (see **Figure 3**). Trade, Transportation and Utilities added the largest number of jobs (5,600 jobs), while Information recorded the largest percent gain in jobs, increasing 1.8%.

**Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU)**

posted a gain of 5,600 jobs (1.1%), slightly below its ten-year average ('03-'12) gain of 5,700 jobs. Within TTU, Retail Trade recorded the majority of gains (3,800 jobs), primarily from gains in General Merchandise (2,600 jobs) and Clothing and Accessories (1,400 jobs). Wholesale Trade gained

300 jobs, below its ten-year average gain of 800 jobs, but slightly above its post-recessionary average gain of 200 jobs. Transportation and Warehousing added 1,600 jobs, while Utilities lost 100 jobs.

**Education and Health Services (EHS)**

added 2,400 jobs (0.6%), more than the ten-year ('03-'12) average (1,500 jobs) and post-recessionary ('09-'12) average (900 jobs) gains. This was the largest December job gain since 2006. Health Care (1,500 jobs) and Social Assistance (500 jobs) recorded a majority of the gains. Within Health Care, Ambulatory Health Care Services (1,000 jobs) and Hospitals (600 jobs) gained jobs, while Nursing and Residential Care Facilities lost 100 jobs. Educational Services recorded job growth (400 jobs) in December, after losses in the three previous Decembers (Dec. '10 – Dec. '12).

**Financial Activities (FA)** added 2,200 jobs (1.2%) in December. This gain was above the ten-year average ('03-'12) gain (1,200 jobs). Although FA has historically gained jobs in December, this gain is the largest December gain since 1997. Finance and Insurance added 1,200 jobs from gains in Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (700 jobs), Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (300 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts and Investments (200 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing recorded a gain of 1,000 jobs.

**Professional and Business Services (PBS)** gained 900 jobs (0.2%), below the ten-year ('03-'12) average gain of 1,700 jobs. Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services only added 400 jobs in a month that historically ('03-'12) has gained 1,700 jobs. Lower-than-average December gains recorded in 2012 (300 jobs) were followed by lower-than-average losses the following month. Administrative and Support and Waste gained 500 jobs from gains recorded in Business Support Services (500 jobs) and Employment Services (300 jobs) and losses in Services to Buildings and Dwellings (-200 jobs). Management of Companies and Enterprises remained unchanged.


Other sectors that recorded December gains include **Information** (700 jobs), **Leisure and Hospitality** (300 jobs) and **Other Services** (100 jobs). Within Leisure and Hospitality, Food Services and Drinking Places gained 800 jobs, while Accomodations (-400 jobs) and Arts, Entertainment and Recreation (-100 jobs) lost jobs.

**Natural Resources & Mining** remained unchanged over the month.

**Government** recorded the largest over-the-month job loss of 4,200 jobs (-1.0%). Gains in Federal Government (500 jobs) were offset by losses in State (-2,400 jobs) and Local (-2,300 jobs) Government. Although seasonal losses are typical in December, losses in both State Education (-2,600 jobs) and Local

Education (-2,500 jobs) were larger than historical average ('03-'12) losses of 1,100 and 1,200 jobs respectively.


**Construction** lost 900 jobs (-0.7%), less than the ten-year (-1,700 jobs) and post-recessionary (-1,500 jobs) average losses. Losses occurred in Buildings (-800 jobs) and Heavy (-700 jobs) Construction. Specialty Trades recorded its first December gain since 2005, adding 600 jobs.

**Manufacturing** shed 200 jobs (-0.1%), primarily from losses in Durable Goods (-300 jobs). Nondurable Goods gained 100 jobs

### Over the Year

Over the year in December, 49,600 Nonfarm jobs were added to Arizona payrolls, an increase of 2.0%. The Nonfarm employment growth rate for calendar year 2013 was also 2.0%. All over-the-year gains were from the Private Sector which added 54,000 jobs (2.6%). Government lost 4,400 jobs with all subsectors reporting losses. Eight of the eleven major sectors reported gains and three sectors reported losses (see **Figure 4**).

**Trade, Transportation and Utilities** reported the largest over-the-year gain of 15,100 jobs (3.1%). This was the largest over-the-year gain since September 2007. The majority of gains (13,600 jobs) were in Trade with 8,200 jobs added from Retail Trade and 5,400 jobs from Wholesale Trade. Within Retail Trade, Motor Vehicles and Parts (2,900 jobs), General Merchandise (1,300 jobs), Food and Beverage (700 jobs), Building Material, Garden Supply (200 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (200 jobs) all added jobs. Clothing and Accessories (-800 jobs) was the only subsector within Retail that lost jobs. Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities added 1,500 jobs. Gains from Transportation and Warehousing (1,900 jobs) were offset by losses in Utilities (-400 jobs).

**Education and Health Services** added 12,800 jobs (3.4%) over the year. Educational Services gained 3,300 jobs with Health Care and Social Assistance adding the remaining 9,500 jobs. Health Care added 6,800 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (5,000 jobs) and Hospitals (1,900 jobs). Nursing and Residential Care Facilities within Health Care lost 100 jobs. Social Assistance gained 2,700 jobs.

**Financial Activities** gained 10,400 jobs (5.8%) over the year. Finance and Insurance added 7,100 jobs, the largest over-the-year-gain since March 2006. Insurance Carriers and Related Activities added 3,000

jobs, Credit Intermediation and Related Activities gained 2,700 jobs, and Securities, Commodity Contracts added 1,400 jobs. Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 3,300 jobs.

**Professional & Business Services** added 6,600 jobs (1.8%) over the year. Administrative and Support and Waste added 4,700 jobs, most of which came from unreported sectors (5,100 jobs). Services to Buildings and Dwellings gained 3,800 jobs, Business Support Services was flat, and Employment Services lost 4,200 jobs. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services gained 2,600 jobs with Management of Companies and Enterprises reporting a loss of 700 jobs.

**Leisure & Hospitality** gained 6,400 jobs (2.4%) over the year. Accommodation and Food Services added 5,300 jobs from Food Services and Drinking Places (5,000 jobs) and Accommodation (300 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 1,100 jobs.

**Construction** added 4,900 jobs (4.2%) over the year. Specialty Trades added 7,800 jobs with both Buildings (-2,800 jobs) and Heavy (-100 jobs) Construction losing jobs.

Other sectors to gain jobs include **Information** (300 jobs) and **Natural Resources & Mining** (100 jobs).

**Government** lost 4,400 jobs (-1.0%) over the year with losses reported in all subsectors. Local Government lost 2,900 jobs with Local Education reporting a loss of 1,300 jobs. Federal Government lost 1,100 jobs. State Government lost 400 jobs, with losses in State Education (-900 jobs) and gains in non-education-related sub sectors (500 jobs).

**Manufacturing** reported a net loss of 2,500 jobs (-1.6%). Nondurable Goods added 1,200 jobs while Durable Goods lost 3,700 jobs. Most of the losses within Durable Goods came from unreported sectors (-2,400).

**Other Services** lost 100 jobs.

## Summary

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped two-tenths of a percentage point from 7.8% in November to 7.6% in December. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped three-tenths of a percentage point from 7.0% in November to 6.7% in December. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 7.9% and the U.S. rate was also 7.9%. Arizona added 6,900 Nonfarm jobs (0.3%), the largest December gain since 2006. While gains in December are typical, this gain was above the ten-year ('03-'12) average (6,700 jobs) and post-recessionary ('09-'12) average (3,600 jobs) gain. The Private Sector added 11,100 jobs (0.5%) and Government reported a loss of 4,200 jobs over the month. Seven of the eleven major sectors added jobs, three reported losses, and one remained flat over the month.


Over the month, Trade, Transportation and Utilities recorded a gain of 5,600 jobs, slightly below the ten-year ('03-'12) average gain of 5,700 jobs. Education and Health Services added 2,400 jobs. This was the largest December job gain for this sector since 2006 and more than the ten-year ('03-'12) average gain of 1,500 jobs. Financial Activities added 2,200 jobs, nearly double the ten-year average ('03-'12) gain of 1,200 jobs. Professional and Business Services gained 900 jobs, below the ten-year ('03-'12) average gain of 1,700 jobs. Information (700 jobs), Leisure and Hospitality (300 jobs), and Other Services (100 jobs)

also reported gains. Government reported a loss of 4,200 jobs. Over-the-month Government losses in December are typical and were recorded in State Education (-2,600 jobs) and Local Education (-2,500 jobs) in preparation for the winter break. Construction lost 900 jobs from Buildings (-800 jobs) and Heavy (-700 jobs) Construction. Specialty Trades recorded its first December gain since 2005, adding 600 jobs. Manufacturing lost 200 jobs. Natural Resources & Mining remained unchanged over the month.


Over the year in December, 49,600 Nonfarm jobs were added to Arizona payrolls, an increase of 2.0%. The Nonfarm employment growth rate for calendar year 2013 was also 2.0%. Job gains (2.6%) in the Private Sector (54,000 jobs) were offset by the losses (-1.0%) in Government (-4,400 jobs). Eight of the eleven major sectors reported gains with three reporting losses. Trade, Transportation and Utilities reported the largest over-the-year gain of 15,100 jobs (3.1%) since September 2007. Education and Health Services added 12,800 jobs (3.4%) followed by Financial Activities which added 10,400 jobs (5.8%). Other major sectors with job gains include: Professional and Business Services (6,600 jobs), Leisure and Hospitality (6,400 jobs), Construction (4,900 jobs), Information (300 jobs), and Natural Resource and Mining (100 jobs). Government (-4,400 jobs), Manufacturing (-2,500 jobs), and Other Services (-100 jobs) reported job losses.


**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate  
Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment  
Year-to-Year Percent Change**






**Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
