Private Sector and Government Shed Fewer Jobs than Average; Unemployment Rate Remains Unchanged at 8.0%

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona remained unchanged at 8.0% in July. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased two-tenths of a percentage point from 7.6% in June to 7.4% in July. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.4% and the U.S. rate was 8.2%. (see **Figure 1**).


Arizona shed 15,100 Nonfarm jobs (-0.6%) in July (see **Figure 2**). Losses in July are typical in both the Private and Government sectors. Seasonal losses within Government were primarily in Local and State Education. Leisure and Hospitality accounted for the majority of the Private Sector loss. Nonfarm job losses in July were lower than the post-recession ('10-'12) average loss (-28,100 jobs) as well as the 10-year ('03-'12) average for July (-27,500 jobs). The Private Sector shed 5,500 jobs, about half the average post-recessionary ('10-'12) loss of 12,100

jobs. Losses in Government (-9,600 jobs) were smaller than the average post-recessionary ('10-'12) loss of 16,000 jobs.

Over the Month by Industry Sector

Five of the eleven major sectors had job gains while six recorded job losses (see **Figure 3**). Education and Health Services recorded the largest over-the-month job gain (500 jobs), followed by Professional and Business Services (400 jobs), Manufacturing (300 jobs), Information (300 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs). Government recorded the largest job loss (-9,600 jobs). The other sectors with job losses include Leisure and Hospitality (-4,800 jobs), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-1,200), Construction (-700), Financial Activities (-200 jobs) and Other Services (-200 jobs).

Education and Health Services (EHS) gained 500 jobs (0.1%), the first positive July job gain since July 1992. EHS historically ('03-'12) averages losses of 2,200 jobs in July. Within EHS, Educational

Services lost 200 jobs, while Health Care (600 jobs) and Social Assistance (100 jobs) added jobs. Losses in Educational Services were well below the 10-year average ('03-'12) loss of 2,400 jobs. Within Health Care, Ambulatory Health Care Services (600 jobs) and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (200 jobs) recorded gains, while Hospitals lost 200 jobs.

Professional and Business Services (PBS) added 400 jobs (0.1%). Although this sector has seen both gains and losses in July, there have been more losses compared to gains. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 800 jobs, slightly above its 10-year ('03-'12) average gain of 200 jobs. Management of Companies and Enterprises (-300 jobs) and Administrative and Support and Waste (-100 jobs) both shed jobs. Employment Services (-2,200 jobs), Services to Buildings and Dwellings (-500 jobs) and Business Support Services (-200 jobs) lost jobs within Administrative and Support and Waste.

Manufacturing added 300 jobs, all of which were from Durable Goods. Nondurable Goods was flat. Within Durable Goods, Fabricated Metals gained 100 jobs and Computer and Electronic Parts gained 200 jobs. Aerospace Products and Parts was flat over the month.

Information gained 300 jobs, all from unreported sectors, and **Natural Resources and Mining** gained 100 jobs.


Government shed 9,600 jobs (-2.6%), less than the 10-year ('03-'12) average loss of 14,700 jobs. Local Government recorded the largest loss, shedding 8,600 jobs. Local Education lost 9,100 jobs, less than the 10-year ('03-'12) average loss of 12,300 jobs. Gains were recorded in non-education sectors within Local Government (500 jobs). State Government lost 900 jobs, all from State Education (-900 jobs). Federal Government shed 100 jobs. Seasonal losses in State and Local Education are expected in July, as schools decrease staffing levels for summer.

Leisure and Hospitality (L&H) lost 4,800 jobs (-1.7%). Losses were observed in all its subsectors. While L&H typically records job losses in July, this loss was less than its 10-year ('03-'12) average loss of 6,300 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation recorded losses (-1,200 jobs), above the 10-year ('03-'12) average loss of 900 jobs. Accommodations (-900 jobs) and Food Services and Drinking Places (-2,700 jobs) recorded job losses.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) lost 1,200 jobs (-0.3%), lower than the post-recessionary-average ('10-'12) loss of 2,000 jobs, but higher than the 10-year ('03-'12) average loss of

1,100 jobs. Losses were recorded in Retail Trade (-700 jobs), Wholesale Trade (-200 jobs), and Transportation and Warehousing (-300 jobs), while Utilities remained flat. Within Retail Trade, Clothing and Accessories recorded job gains (100 jobs) while all other subsectors recorded small job losses or remained unchanged.

Construction lost 700 jobs, primarily from Building (-700 jobs) and Heavy (-500 jobs) Construction. **Financial Activities** and **Other Services** both shed 200 jobs. Smaller-than-average losses in Other Services could have resulted from above-average losses recorded in June.


Over the Year

Arizona added 67,600 Nonfarm jobs (2.8%), the largest over-the-year gain since January 2007. Of these gains, the Private Sector added 59,600 jobs (2.9%), and Government added 8,000 jobs (2.2%). This marks the 24th month of over-the-year Private Sector growth at or above 2.0%. Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains with one reporting a loss (see **Figure 4**).

Leisure & Hospitality reported the largest over-the-year gain of 13,000 jobs (5.0%). Gains were driven by Accommodation and Food Services (11,000 jobs), which recorded the largest over-the-year gain since March 2006. Food Services and Drinking places added 10,100 jobs, and Accommodation added 900 jobs. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation added an additional 2,000 jobs.

Education and Health Services (EHS)

added 12,000 jobs (3.4%) over the year. Health Care & Social Assistance added 8,900 jobs, while Educational Services added 3,100 jobs. Within Health Care & Social Assistance, Health Care added 7,100 jobs primarily from Ambulatory Health Care Services (5,500 jobs). Nursing & Residential Care Facilities gained 1,100 jobs, and Hospitals gained 500 jobs. Social Assistance added the remaining 1,800 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 9,600 jobs (2.0%) over the year. Trade reported a gain of 10,600 jobs, while Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities shed 1,000 jobs. Wholesale Trade added 6,200 jobs, the largest over-the-year gain since December 1996. Retail Trade added 4,400 jobs, with gains from Motor Vehicles and Parts (2,400 jobs), Food and Beverage (1,200 jobs), and Building Material, Garden Supply industries (800 jobs). These gains were offset by losses in General Merchandise (-600 jobs), Clothing and Accessories (-400 jobs), and Furniture and Home Furnishings (-300 jobs). Transportation and Warehousing (-700 jobs) and Utilities (-300 jobs) both shed jobs over the year.

Construction added 8,200 jobs growing by 6.9% over the year. This marks the 12th consecutive month of over-the-year growth at or above 5.0%. Specialty Trades (7,400 jobs) and Heavy Construction (800 jobs) both added jobs,

while Building Construction was flat over the year.

Government gained 8,000 jobs over the year (2.2%). State (5,500 jobs) and Local Government (3,300 jobs) added jobs, while Federal Government shed 800 jobs over the year.

Professional and Business Services added 8,000 jobs (2.3%). Administrative and Support and Waste added 5,700 jobs, most of which came from unreported sectors. Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services added 3,200 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 900 jobs.

Financial Activities gained 7,400 jobs (4.2%), the largest gain since July 2006. Finance and Insurance added 4,200 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (2,200 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,500 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (500 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 3,200 jobs, the largest gain since May 2006.

Information added 1,400 jobs (3.7%), primarily from unreported sectors. **Manufacturing** gained 900 jobs from Durable Goods (500 jobs) and Nondurable Goods (400 jobs). **Natural Resources and Mining** added 300 jobs.

The only sector to lose jobs over the year was **Other Services**, which shed 1,200 jobs (-1.4%).





The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona remained unchanged at 8.0% in July. However, the U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped two-tenths of a percentage point from 7.6% in June to 7.4% in July. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 8.4%, and the U.S. rate was 8.2%. In July, Arizona reported a net loss of 15,100 Nonfarm jobs (-0.6%). Both the Private Sector (-5,500 jobs) and Government (-9,600 jobs) shed jobs. These losses were relatively small in comparison to the average post-recessionary ('10-'12) loss of 12,100 jobs and 1,900 jobs respectively. Seasonal losses within Government were primarily in Local and State Education. Leisure and Hospitality accounted for the majority of the Private Sector loss. Five of the eleven major sectors had job gains, while six recorded job losses.

Over the month, Education and Health Services reported the largest gain, with 500 jobs. This is the first July job gain in Education and Health Services since 1992. EHS historically ('03-'12) averages losses of 2,200 jobs in July. Within EHS, Educational Services lost 200 jobs in July, significantly lower than the historic-average ('03-'12) loss of 2,400 jobs. Health Care (600 jobs) and Social Assistance (100 jobs) added jobs. While Professional and Business Services added 400 jobs, the 10-year average ('03-'12) is a loss of 1,300 jobs. Manufacturing (300 jobs), Information (300 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs) also recorded job gains. The largest loss was in Government, which shed 9,600 jobs. Most of these seasonal losses occurred in State and Local Education, as schools decreased staffing levels for summer. Leisure and Hospitality lost 4,800 jobs, less than the 10-year-average ('03-'12) loss of 6,300 jobs. Other sectors with over-the-month losses include Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-1,200 jobs), Construction (-700 jobs), Financial Activities (-200 jobs), and Other Services (-200 jobs).

Arizona added 67,600 Nonfarm jobs (2.8%) over the year in July. This is the highest Nonfarm job gain over the year since January 2007. The Private Sector added 59,600 jobs (2.9%), marking the 24th consecutive month of over-the-year growth in jobs at or above 2.0%. Government added the remaining 8,000 jobs (2.2%). Ten of the eleven major sectors reported job gains, with one reporting job loss. Leisure & Hospitality reported the largest over-the-year gain (13,000 jobs) followed by Education and Health Services (12,000 jobs). Other major sectors which reported job gains include: Trade, Transportation and Utilities (9,600 jobs), Construction (8,200 jobs), Government (8,000 jobs), Professional and Business Services (8,000 jobs), Financial Activities (7,400 jobs), Information (1,400

jobs), Manufacturing (900), and Natural Resources and Mining (300 jobs). Other Services shed 1,200 jobs.





Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
