Seasonal Losses in Government; Slight Uptick in Unemployment Rate to 7.0%

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona increased one-tenth of a percentage point from 6.9% in June to 7.0% in July. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also increased one-tenth of a percentage point from 6.1% in June to 6.2% in July. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.3%. (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona shed 10,400 Nonfarm jobs (-0.4%) in July (see **Figure 2**). Losses were recorded within Government, which is typical in July. Seasonal losses within Government were primarily in Local and State Education. The Private Sector recorded small gains (200 jobs), in a month that has historically ('04-'13) recorded losses (-12,900 jobs). Nonfarm job losses in July were lower than the post-recession ('09-'13) average loss (-26,500 jobs) as well as the 10-year ('04-'13) average for July (-26,400 jobs). Losses in Government (-10,600 jobs) were smaller than the post-recessionary ('09-'13) average loss of 13,500 jobs.



Over the Month by Industry Sector

Six of the eleven major sectors had job gains while five recorded job losses (see **Figure 3**). Trade, Transportation, and Utilities recorded the largest over-the-month job gain (2,600 jobs). It was followed by Professional and Business Services (1,500 jobs), Educational and Health Services (1,100 jobs), and Other Services (900 jobs). Information (200 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (200 jobs) had small gains. Government recorded the largest job loss (-10,600 jobs). The other sectors with job losses include Leisure and Hospitality (-3,900 jobs), Financial Activities (-1,200 jobs), Construction (-1,100), and Manufacturing (-100 jobs).

Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) gained 2,600 jobs (0.5%); an atypical gain when compared to the post-recessionary-average ('09-'13) loss of 1,700 jobs and the 10-year ('04-'13) average

loss of 1,000 jobs. Gains in Retail Trade (2,200 jobs), Transportation and Warehousing (500 jobs), and Utilities (100 jobs) were offset slightly by losses in Wholesale Trade (-200 jobs). Within Retail Trade, Clothing and Accessories (400 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (400 jobs), Department Stores (100 jobs) and Other General Merchandise Stores (100 jobs) recorded job gains while all other subsectors recorded small job losses.

Professional and Business Services (PBS) added 1,500 jobs (0.4%). Historically ('04-'13) PBS has lost 1,200 jobs in July. Administrative and Support and Waste (1,100 jobs) recorded its first July job gain since 2005. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 400 jobs, slightly above its 10-year ('04-'13) average gain of 200 jobs. Employment Services (1,400 jobs) and Services to Buildings and Dwellings (300 jobs) gained jobs, while Business Support Services (-100 jobs) lost jobs within Administrative and Support and Waste. Management of Companies and Enterprises remained flat.

Education and Health Services (EHS) gained 1,100 jobs (0.3%), the first positive July job gain since July 1992. EHS historically ('04-'13) averages losses of 2,300 jobs in July. Within EHS, Educational Services (-100 jobs) and Social Assistance (-300 jobs) lost jobs, while Health Care added 1,500 jobs. Losses in Educational Services were well below the 10-year average ('04-'13) loss of 2,400 jobs. Within Health Care, Ambulatory Health Care Services (1,400 jobs) and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (100 jobs) recorded gains, while Hospitals remained flat.


Other Services gained 900 jobs. **Information** gained 200 jobs, all from unreported sectors, and **Natural Resources and Mining** gained 100 jobs.

Government shed 10,600 jobs (-2.8%), less than the 10-year ('04-'13) average loss of 13,500 jobs. Local Government recorded the largest loss, shedding 9,700 jobs. Local Education lost 10,400 jobs, less than the 10-year ('04-'13) average loss of 11,600 jobs. Gains were recorded in non-education sectors within Local Government (700 jobs). State Government lost 800 jobs, half of them from State Education (-400 jobs). Federal Government shed 100 jobs. Seasonal losses in State and Local Education are expected in July, as schools decrease staffing levels for summer.

Leisure and Hospitality (L&H) lost 3,900 jobs (-1.4%). Losses were observed in all its subsectors. While L&H typically records job losses in July, this loss was less than its 10-year ('04-'13) average loss of 6,300 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation recorded fewer losses (-100 jobs), compared to the 10-year ('04-'13) average loss of 900 jobs. Food Services and Drinking Places (-2,700 jobs) and Accommodations (-1,100 jobs) also recorded job losses.

Financial Activities (FA) lost 1,200 jobs (-0.6%). This is an atypical July loss. Historically ('04-'13) FA averages a gain of 100 jobs. Losses were recorded in

Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (-900 jobs) and Finance and Insurance (-300 jobs).

Construction lost 1,100 jobs (-0.9%), more than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 200 jobs. Building Construction (-500 jobs), Specialty Trades (-500 jobs), and Heavy Construction (-100 jobs) all lost jobs.


Over the Year

Arizona added 59,400 Nonfarm jobs (2.4%), the largest over-the-year gain of 2014. Of these gains, the Private Sector added 56,400 jobs (2.7%), and Government added 3,000 jobs (0.8%). This marks the 36th month of over-the-year Private Sector growth at or above 2.0%. Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains with one reporting a loss (see **Figure 4**).

Education and Health Services (EHS) added 19,900 jobs (5.5%) over the year. Health Care & Social Assistance added 13,100 jobs, while Educational Services added 6,800 jobs. Within Health Care & Social Assistance, Health Care added 10,100 jobs primarily from Ambulatory Health Care Services (7,000 jobs), Hospitals (2,600 jobs) and Nursing & Residential Care Facilities (500 jobs). Social Assistance added the remaining 3,000 jobs.

Leisure & Hospitality reported the second largest over-the-year gain of 11,800 jobs (4.4%). Gains were driven by Accommodation and Food Services (8,800 jobs), which recorded the largest over-the-year gain since December 2006. Food Services and Drinking places added 8,700 jobs, and Accommodation added 100 jobs. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation added an additional 3,000 jobs.

Professional and Business Services added 11,000 jobs (3.0%). Administrative and Support and Waste added 10,800 jobs. Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services added 800 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 600 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 10,200 jobs (2.1%) over the year. Trade reported a gain of 8,700 jobs, while Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities shed 1,500 jobs. Wholesale Trade added 1,900 jobs. Retail Trade added 6,800 jobs, with gains from General Merchandise (900 jobs), Motor Vehicles and Parts (800 jobs), Food and Beverage (700 jobs), and Furniture and Home Furnishings industries (700 jobs). These gains were offset by losses in Clothing and Accessories (-100 jobs). Transportation and Warehousing gained jobs (1,800 jobs) and Utilities lost 300 jobs over the year.

Financial Activities gained 7,600 jobs. Finance and Insurance added 6,100 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (3,900 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,200 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (1,000 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 1,500 jobs over-the-year.

Government gained 3,000 jobs over the year (0.8%). State (1,600 jobs) and Local Government

(1,700 jobs) added jobs, while Federal Government shed 300 jobs over the year.

Construction was the only industry to lose jobs, shedding 6,200 jobs (-4.9%) over the year. This marks the 3rd consecutive month of over-the-year losses and the largest over-the-year loss since September 2010. Building Construction recorded its 10th consecutive month of over-the-year losses, shedding 3,800 jobs. Specialty Trades lost 3,400 jobs, while Heavy Construction added 1,000 jobs over the year.

Other Services gained 1,200 jobs. **Manufacturing** gained 500 jobs from Nondurable Goods (800 jobs). **Natural Resources and Mining** added 100 jobs. **Information** added 300 jobs over the year.



Other sectors to record job gains include Educational and Health Services (1,100 jobs), Other Services (900 jobs), Information (200 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (200 jobs). Government recorded the largest job loss (-10,600 jobs). The other sectors with job losses include Leisure and Hospitality (-3,900 jobs), Financial Activities (-1,200 jobs), Construction (-1,100), and Manufacturing (-100 jobs).



Other Services (1,200 jobs), Manufacturing (500), Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs) and Information (300 jobs) had small gains. Construction was the only industry to record job losses, shedding 6,200 jobs.


**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change**






**Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
