Seasonal Losses in Local and State Public Education; Uptick in Unemployment Rate to 6.9%

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona reported a slight uptick from 6.8% in May to 6.9% in June. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped two-tenths of a percentage point to 6.1% in June. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.5% (see **Figure 1**).


Arizona reported a net loss of 39,500 Nonfarm jobs (-1.5%) over the month in June (see **Figure 2**). June is typically a month of Nonfarm job losses. This loss was fewer than the ten-year average ('04-'13) loss of 44,000 jobs and post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 55,000 jobs. The majority of losses were in Government which shed 36,000 jobs. These were seasonal losses which typically occur this time of year in Local (-30,400 jobs) and State (-6,000 jobs) Public Education. The Private Sector also recorded a net loss of 3,500 jobs, fewer than the ten-year-average ('04-'13) loss of 4,600 jobs and post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 8,200 jobs.


Over the Month by Industry Sector

Five of the eleven major sectors added jobs and six reported jobs losses (see **Figure 3**) over the month in June. Professional and Business Services (3,900 jobs) recorded the largest gain. The other gaining sectors over the month were Financial Activities (2,200 jobs), Manufacturing (900 jobs), Natural Resources and Mining (300 jobs) and Information (300 jobs). Government (-36,000 jobs) recorded the largest loss over the month in June. Other sectors with job losses over the month included Educational and Health Services (-5,500 jobs), Leisure and Hospitality (2,500 jobs), Other Services (-2,000 jobs), Trade Transportation, and Utilities (-700 jobs) and Construction (-400 jobs). Historically ('90-'13), losses have been observed in Government and Leisure and Hospitality sectors in June.

Professional and Business Services gained 3,900 jobs (1.0%) over the month. This gain was

four times larger than the ten-year-average gain of 900 jobs, and nearly twenty-times the post-recessionary ('10-'13) gain of 200 jobs. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services recorded its largest June over-the-month employment increase on record ('90-'14), gaining 2,100 jobs. Administrative and Support and Waste also recorded above historical average ('04-'13) gains (1,900 jobs). These were from Employment Services (500 jobs), Services to Buildings and Dwellings (500 jobs) and Business Support Services (400 jobs). Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 100 jobs.

Financial Activities recorded its largest over-the-month June increase on record ('90-'14), gaining 2,200 jobs (1.2%). Historically ('04-'13) Financial Activities has averaged a gain of 200 jobs and a post-recession average ('10-'13) gain of 300 jobs. Gains were recorded in Finance and Insurance (1,700 jobs) and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (500 jobs). Within Finance and Insurance, Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (1,100 jobs) and Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (700 jobs) gained jobs, while Securities and Commodity Contracts lost 100 jobs.



Manufacturing added 900 jobs (0.6%) over the month. This gain was larger than the ten-year-average gain of 600 jobs, and the post-recessionary ('10-'13) average gain of 600 jobs. Gains in June are typical for this sector with the exception of two recessionary years ('08 and '09). Durable Goods added 900 jobs, while Nondurable Goods remained flat.

Natural Resources and Mining and Information gained 300 jobs each.

Government shed 36,000 jobs (-8.9%) over the month, lower than the ten-year-average ('04-'13) loss of 39,400 jobs. Local Government lost the most, shedding 30,400 jobs. All the losses were in Local Education (-32,700 jobs) with non-education-related subsectors gaining 2,300 jobs. State Government lost 6,000 jobs, all from State Education (-6,000 jobs). Losses in State Education were lower than the ten-year-average ('04-'13) loss of 8,500 jobs, and the post-recessionary ('10-'13) loss of 10,700 jobs. Larger-than-average losses recorded in May 2014 have resulted in lower over-the-month losses for this sector. Federal Government added 400 jobs. Large losses in State and Local Education are typical this time of year, as schools decrease staffing levels for summer.

Educational and Health Services lost 5,500 jobs (-1.4%) over the month. The majority of losses were from Educational Services, which lost 4,000 jobs. Health Care lost 300 jobs. Losses in Ambulatory Health Care Services (-300 jobs) and Hospitals (-100 jobs) were offset by gains in Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (100 jobs). Social Assistance lost 1,200 jobs. While losses in Social Assistance are typical for June, this was the largest June over-the-month loss on record ('90-'14).

Leisure and Hospitality shed 2,500 jobs (-0.9%) over the month. This was fewer than the ten-year average ('04-'13) loss of 4,800 jobs and post-recession average ('10-'13) loss of 5,500 jobs. Accommodation and Food Services reported a net job loss of 2,700 jobs, with gains in Accommodation (700 jobs) being offset by losses in Food Services and Drinking Places (-3,400 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation gained 200 jobs.

Other sectors recording over-the-month job losses include: **Other Services** (-2,000 jobs), **Trade, Transportation, and Utilities** (-700 jobs), and **Construction** (-400 jobs). Construction has typically gained in June with losses observed in some years ('08, '09, '14). Historically ('04-'13) Construction has averaged a gain of 2,400 jobs.


Over the Year

Over the year, 42,800 Nonfarm jobs (1.7%) were added to payrolls in Arizona. The Private Sector accounted for all over-the-year gains adding 45,900 jobs (2.2%). Government shed 3,100 jobs (-0.8%). Seven of the eleven major sectors added jobs, one reported no change, and three sectors shed jobs (see **Figure 4**).

Education and Health Services reported the largest gain of 15,200 jobs (4.1%) over the year. Health Care and Social Assistance added 10,300 jobs over the year. Health Care added 8,000 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (5,400 jobs), Hospitals (2,100 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (500 jobs). The remaining 2,300 jobs were reported in Social Assistance. Educational Services added 4,900 jobs, reporting an over-the-year growth rate of 9.4%.

Leisure and Hospitality (L&H) added 12,100 jobs (4.4%), the largest over-the-year gain since November 2006. The majority of gains were from Accommodations and Food Services which added 9,500 jobs. These gains were primarily in Food Services and Drinking Places (8,800 jobs) and some in Accommodations (700 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 2,600 jobs.

Financial Activities added 9,100 jobs (4.9%) over the year. Finance and Insurance gained 6,900 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (4,900 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,100 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts



(900 jobs). The gain in Insurance Carriers and Related Activities of 4,900 jobs was the highest over-the-year gain on record ('91 – '14). The Insurance Carriers and Related Activities over-the-year growth rate so far this year is 10.2%. Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 2,200 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 7,500 jobs (1.6%) over the year. Within Trade (6,900 jobs), both Retail (5,400 jobs) and Wholesale Trade (1,500 jobs) added jobs. In Retail Trade, Motor Vehicles and Parts (1,300 jobs), Food and Beverage (1,100 jobs), General Merchandise (800 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (400 jobs), and Building Material, Garden Supply (400 jobs) added jobs with Clothing and Accessories shedding 200 jobs. Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities added 600 jobs, with losses in Utilities (-300 jobs) being offset by gains in Transportation and Warehousing (900 jobs).

Professional and Business Services gained 5,500 jobs (1.5%) over the year. Administration and Support and Waste added 6,800 jobs with gains in Business Support Services (2,900 jobs) and Employment Services (2,800 jobs), and losses in Services to Buildings and Dwellings (-300 jobs). Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 100 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises shed 1,400 jobs.

Manufacturing added 600 jobs (0.4%) over the year, all from Nondurable Goods which gained 1,000 jobs. Durable Goods shed 400 jobs.

Information added 400 jobs and **Natural Resources and Mining** reported no change over the year.

Construction shed 4,000 jobs (-3.2%) over the year. This was the second consecutive over-the-year loss in Construction which, prior to May 2014, reported 34 months of over-the-year gains. Heavy Construction added 1,000 jobs with Building Construction (-3,300 jobs) and Specialty Trade (-1,700 jobs) recording losses. While Building Construction has been shedding jobs over the year since October 2013, this was the largest loss since May 2010. The loss in Specialty Trade was the first over-the-year loss since June 2011.

Government shed 3,100 jobs (-0.8%) over the year. Local Government shed 3,700 jobs, most of which came from Local Education (-3,100 jobs). State Government added 1,400 jobs and Federal Government shed 800 jobs.

Other Services lost 500 jobs over the year.

Summary

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona reported a slight uptick from 6.8% in May to 6.9% in June. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped two-tenths of a percentage point to 6.1% in June. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.5%.


Arizona shed 39,500 Nonfarm jobs (-1.5%) over the month in June. This loss was fewer than the ten-year ('04-'13) average job loss of 44,000 jobs and the post-recessionary ('10-'13) average loss of 55,000 jobs. Losses were primarily in Government which shed 36,000 jobs. These were seasonal losses in Local (-30,400 jobs) and State (-6,000 jobs) Public Education. The Private Sector lost 3,500 jobs, a smaller loss than the ten-year-average ('04-'13) loss of 4,600 jobs and post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 8,200 jobs. Five of the eleven major sectors added jobs and six reported jobs losses over the month in June. The largest gain was in Professional and Business Services (3,900 jobs). This gain was more than four-

times the ten-year-average gain of 900 jobs and nearly twenty-times the post-recessionary ('10-'13) gain of 200 jobs. Financial Activities added 2,200 jobs, the largest over-the-month gain on record ('90-'14) for the month of June. Financial Activities has averaged a gain of 200 jobs over ten years ('04-'13) and a post-recessionary ('10-'13) average gain of 300 jobs. Manufacturing (900 jobs), Natural Resources and Mining (300 jobs), and Information (300 jobs) all added jobs over the month. Government lost 36,000 jobs, a smaller loss in comparison to the ten-year-average ('04-'13) loss of 39,400 jobs and post-recessionary ('10-'13) average loss of 46,800 jobs. The below average Government loss in June may be the result of a shift in the education schedule as above-average losses were observed in Government in May. Other sectors with job losses include Education and Health Services (-5,500 jobs), Leisure and Hospitality (-2,500 jobs), Other Services (-2,000 jobs), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-700 jobs), and Construction (-400 jobs). Losses in Construction are atypical for June which has averaged a gain of 2,400 jobs over ten-years ('04-'13).


Over the year, Arizona added 42,800 Nonfarm jobs (1.7%) to the payroll in June. All the gains were from the Private Sector which added 45,900 jobs (2.2%). Government lost 3,100 jobs (-0.8%). Seven of the eleven major sectors added jobs, one reported no change, and three sectors lost jobs. Education and Health Services reported the largest over-the-year gains of 15,200 jobs. Leisure and Hospitality added 12,100 jobs, the largest over-the-year gain in this sector since November 2006. Financial Activities added 9,100 jobs followed by Trade, Transportation and Utilities (7,500 jobs), and Professional and Business Services (5,500 jobs). Manufacturing (600 jobs), and Information (400 jobs) had small gains. Natural Resources and Mining was flat over the year. Construction shed 4,000 jobs, the second consecutive over-the-year loss since June 2011. Government (-3,100 jobs) and Other Services (-500 jobs) both shed jobs.

Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**







**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
