Leisure & Hospitality Sector Drives Above-Average Private Sector Gains

Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained unchanged at 7.9% in March. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.7% in February to 7.6% in March. A year ago the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.4%, and the U.S. rate was 8.2% (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona added 16,600 Nonfarm jobs (0.7%) in March (see **Figure 2**). This job gain is lower compared to the gains recorded in March 2012 (17,700 jobs). However, it remains above the historical, ten-year average ('03-'12) gain of 12,400 jobs.


The Private Sector accounted for all of the job gains in March, adding 17,900 jobs. Historically ('03-'12), the Private Sector has added 13,000 jobs in March. Government lost 1,300 jobs, more than twice the ten-year ('03-'12) average loss of 500 jobs. These losses were driven by above-average losses in Local (-900 jobs) and State Public Education (-500 jobs).

Over the Month by Industry Sector

Of the eleven major sectors, eight added jobs, one was flat and two reported losses over the month (see **Figure 3**). Leisure and Hospitality recorded the largest over-the-month gain (7,100 jobs), while Government recorded the largest job loss (-1,300 jobs).

Leisure and Hospitality (L&H) added 7,100 jobs (2.6%), a gain much larger compared to its historical ('03-'12) average gain of 5,000 jobs. The majority of these jobs were gained in Food Services and Drinking Places (5,200 jobs), which recorded its largest over-the-month percentage gain since February 1994 (216 months). Stronger March 2013 gains could be compensating for below-average gains recorded in February (3,400 jobs). Accommodation added 900 jobs, slightly more

than its ten-year average ('03-'12) of 700 jobs. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation gained 1,000 jobs in March. Jobs within this sector were revised upward from 2,000 to 2,900 jobs in February.


Professional and Business Services (PBS) gained 2,900 jobs. Administrative and Support and Waste added 4,400 jobs, its largest March gain since 2000. Within this sector, gains were recorded in Employment Services (1,900 jobs), Business Support Services (200 jobs), and Services to Buildings and Dwellings (100 jobs). The largest loss within Professional and Business Services occurred in Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (-1,400 jobs). Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services has averaged a gain of 100 jobs ('03-'12) and has recorded only two other losses in March ('08 & '09). Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 100 jobs.

Construction gained 2,600 jobs (2.2%), above its historical average gain ('03-'12) of 1,500 jobs. All gains came from Specialty Trades, which added 2,900 jobs, more than double the ten-year average gain of 1,300 jobs. Heavy Construction recorded over-the-month losses of 300 jobs while Buildings Construction remained flat.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) added 2,400 jobs, twice its ten-year average gain of 1,200 jobs. Overall Trade gained 1,400 jobs with gains in Retail Trade (1,600 jobs) and losses in Wholesale Trade (-200 jobs). Gains in Retail Trade were driven by atypical gains in Motor Vehicles and Parts (900 jobs), and gains in Building Material, Garden Supply (600 jobs). Transportation and Warehousing reported a gain of 1,000 jobs, the largest over-the-month March gain on record (1990-2013). Utilities remained flat over the month.

Education and Health Services (EHS) gained 1,700 jobs (0.5%). Health Care added 1,500 jobs, with gains coming from Ambulatory Health Care Services (1,200 jobs), Hospitals (200 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (100 jobs). Both Educational Services and Social Assistance gained 100 jobs.

Other Services (600 jobs), **Financial Activities** (500 jobs), and **Manufacturing** (300 jobs) added jobs in March. Gains in Other Services were below the ten-year ('03-'12) average gains of 1,100 jobs. **Natural Resources and Mining** was flat while **Information** lost 200 jobs over the month.




Government had the largest over-the-month loss (-1,300 jobs). Losses within Government were primarily in Local (-900 jobs) and State (-500 jobs) Public Education with a smaller loss in Federal Government (-100 jobs). State Education has averaged a loss of 100 jobs over ten years ('03-'12).

Over the Year

Arizona gained 45,100 Nonfarm jobs (1.8%) over the year in March. This is the second month of below-two-percent, over-the-year Nonfarm job growth after February's employment gain was revised downward (2.0% to 1.9%). The Private Sector added 41,600 jobs (2.0%). This marks the 20th consecutive month of over-the-year growth at or above 2.0%, which began in August 2011. Government added 3,500 jobs (0.8%). Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains with one reporting a loss (see Figure 4).

Leisure and Hospitality reported the largest over-the-year gain of 9,900 jobs (3.6%). Accommodation and Food Services added the most jobs (7,000 jobs), with gains in Food Services and Drinking Places (7,900 jobs) being offset by losses in Accommodation (-900 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 2,900 jobs.



Construction had the second largest gain of 7,900 jobs. All three construction subsectors reported strong over-the-year growth. The majority of gains were in Specialty Trades (5,000 jobs), followed by Heavy (1,600 jobs) and Building Construction (1,300 jobs).

Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 5,600 jobs (1.2%). Overall, Trade added 5,400 jobs, of which 4,900 jobs were added from Wholesale Trade, and another 500 jobs were added from Retail Trade. Within Retail, only Motor Vehicles and Parts reported gains (1,800 jobs). Transportation and Warehousing added 500 jobs while Utilities lost 300 jobs.

Education and Health Services gained 5,600 jobs (1.5%). Losses in Educational Services (1,600 jobs) were offset by gains in Health Care (6,200 jobs) and Social Assistance (1,000 jobs).

Financial Activities added 5,200 jobs (3.0%). Finance and Insurance added 4,200 jobs, primarily from gains in Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (2,700 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,400 jobs), and a small gain in Securities, and Commodity Contracts (100 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 1,000 jobs.

Professional and Business Services gained 4,700 jobs (1.3%). Administrative and Support and Waste gained 5,900 jobs while Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (-1,000 jobs) and Management of Companies and Enterprises (-200 jobs) shed jobs. The employment loss in Management of Companies and Enterprises was the first since December 2010.

Government added 3,500 jobs (0.8%). State (3,400 jobs) and Local Government (1,100 jobs) added jobs over the year as Federal Government lost jobs (-1,000 jobs).

Information gained 1,600 jobs. **Manufacturing** added 1,100 jobs, of which 900 jobs were from Durable Goods and 200 jobs from Nondurable Goods. **Natural Resources and Mining** added 200 jobs. **Other Services** lost 200 jobs.

Summary


Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained flat in March at 7.9%. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.7% in February to 7.6% in March. A year ago the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.4%, and the U.S. rate was 8.2%. Arizona gained 16,600 Nonfarm jobs in March, higher than the ten-year average ('03-'12) gain of 12,400 jobs. All over-the-month gains were in the Private Sector which added 17,900 jobs. Government lost 1,300 jobs, primarily from Local (-900 jobs) and State Public Education (-500 jobs). Eight of the eleven major sectors added jobs, one was flat, and two reported losses.

Over the month, Leisure and Hospitality recorded the largest gain with 7,100 jobs, higher than the ten-year ('03-'12) average gain of 5,000 jobs. Gains in Professional and Business Services (2,900 jobs) were driven by Administrative and Support and Waste (4,400 jobs), which reported the largest March job increase since 2000. Construction (2,600 jobs) and Trade, Transportation and Utilities (2,400 jobs) reported above-average historical ('03-'12) gains in March. Other sectors with gains included Education and Health Services (1,700 jobs), Other Services (600 jobs), Financial Activities (500 jobs), and Manufacturing (300 jobs). Natural Resources and Mining was flat. Government (-1,300 jobs) and Information (-200 jobs) shed jobs.


Over the year, Arizona's Nonfarm employment grew by 45,100 jobs (1.8%) in March. February's employment numbers were revised downward, and Nonfarm job growth dropped to 1.9%. The employment gain in March of 1.8% is the second month of over-the-year Nonfarm growth below 2.0%. The Private Sector added 41,600 jobs (2.0%), marking the 20th consecutive month of over-the-year job growth at or above 2.0%. Government gained 3,500 jobs (0.8%). Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains while one reported a loss. The largest over-the-year gain occurred in Leisure and Hospitality (9,900 jobs) followed by Construction (7,900 jobs) which reported the highest over-the-year percentage gain among the major sectors (7.1%). Other major sectors reporting gains include Trade, Transportation and Utilities (5,600 jobs), Education and Health Services (5,600 jobs), Financial Activities (5,200 jobs), Professional and Business Services (4,700 jobs), Government (3,500 jobs), Information (1,600 jobs), Manufacturing (1,100 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (200 jobs). Other Services was the only major sector to report over-the-year losses (-200 jobs).


**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change**






Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Employment Services Year-to-Year Percent Change
