**Above Average Seasonal Losses in Local and State Education;
Unemployment Rate Drops to 6.8%**

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped one-tenth of a percentage point from 6.9% in April to 6.8% in May. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained unchanged at 6.3% in May. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0% and the U.S. rate was 7.5% (see Figure 1).

Arizona shed 15,000 Nonfarm jobs (-0.6%) over the month in May (see **Figure 2**). This was the largest May loss since 2009. This loss is atypical for May as the post-recession ('10-'13) average shows no job change. Losses were reported in both the Private Sector (-800 jobs, 0.0%) and Government (-14,200 jobs, -3.4%). The Private Sector averaged a gain of 1,100 jobs post-recession ('10-'13). Although Government losses are typical, May losses were much higher compared to the post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 1,100 jobs.



Six of the eleven major sectors added jobs, one was flat, and four reported losses over the month (see **Figure 3**). Manufacturing recorded the largest over-the-month gain of 1,600 jobs. The largest loss of 14,200 jobs was reported in Government.


Manufacturing added 1,600 jobs (1.0%), higher than the post-recession ('10-'13) average gain of 600 jobs. Durable Goods added 1,500 jobs, the highest over-the-month gain since February 2007. Nondurable Goods added the remaining 100 jobs.

Other Services added 1,100 jobs. This gain was higher than the post-recession ('10-'13) average gain of 400 jobs.

Education and Health Services gained 800 jobs, slightly below the post-recession ('10-'13)

average gain of 900 jobs. Health Care added 300 jobs and Social Assistance added 300 jobs. Within Health Care, gains in Ambulatory Health Care Services (900 jobs) were offset by losses in Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (-500 jobs) and Hospitals (-100 jobs). Educational Services gained 200 jobs.

Other sectors which reported gains were **Information** (500 jobs, 1.2%), **Transportation & Utilities** (200 jobs) and **Financial Activities** (100 jobs, 0.1%).

Natural Resources and Mining was flat over the month.

Government had the largest loss of 14,200 jobs (-3.4%). This loss was nearly thirteen times higher than the post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 1,100 jobs. This above average loss can be attributed to unusually large losses in Local (9,300 jobs) and State Education (7,800 jobs). Local Government overall shed 7,400 jobs with Local Education losing 9,300 jobs and local non-education related sectors adding 1,900 jobs. The post-recession ('10-'13) average loss in Local Education is 3,700 jobs. In State Government, State Education shed 7,800 jobs and State non-education related sectors added 900 jobs for a net loss of 6,900 jobs. The post-recession ('10-'13) average loss in State Education is 1,700 jobs.

The Federal Government added 100 jobs.

Professional and Business Services lost 3,400 jobs, twice the post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 1,700 jobs. Administrative and Support and Waste (-1,800 jobs) and Professional, Scientific and Technical Service (-1,600 jobs) shed jobs while Management of Companies and Enterprises was flat. Within Administrative and Support and Waste, Employment Services shed 2,500 jobs, Services to Buildings and Dwellings lost 700 jobs and Business Support Services added 200 jobs. The losses in Employment Services was unusual for May which has a post-recession ('10-'13) average gain of 400 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality shed 1,500 jobs. This loss was similar to the post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 1,400 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation shed 900 jobs and Accommodation and Food Services lost 600 jobs. Gains in Accommodation (300 jobs) were offset by losses in Food Services and Drinking Places (-900 jobs).

Construction lost 200 jobs. The post-recession ('10-'13) average is a gain of 1,000 jobs. Heavy Construction added 500 jobs with losses in Building Construction (-600 jobs) and Specialty Trade (-100 jobs). This was the third consecutive over-the-month loss in Specialty Trade which has an average post-recession ('10-'13) gain of 900 jobs.

Over the Year

Arizona added 31,000 Nonfarm jobs (1.2%) over the year, the lowest reported over-the-year growth since July 2010. The Private Sector accounted for all of the gains adding 42,700 jobs (2.0%) over the year in May. Government reported a loss of 11,700 jobs, with Federal, State, and Local Government all shedding jobs. Eight of the eleven major sectors added jobs and three reported losses.

Education and Health Services reported the largest gain of 13,800 jobs (3.7%) over the year. Health Care added 7,200 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (5,300 jobs) and Hospitals (1,900 jobs). Nursing and Residential Care Facilities reported no change over the year. Social Assistance gained 2,500 jobs. Educational Services added the remaining 4,100 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality added 8,700 jobs (3.1%) over the year. Accommodation and Food Services added 7,000 jobs, 6,900 jobs from Food Services and Drinking Places and 100 jobs from Accommodation. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 1,700 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 8,500 jobs (1.8%) over the year, primarily from Trade (8,400 jobs). Wholesale Trade added 2,900 jobs and Retail Trade added 5,500 jobs. Within Retail Trade, Motor Vehicles and Parts (1,400 jobs), General Merchandise (1,100 jobs), Food and Beverage (1,000 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (700 jobs), and Building Material, Garden Supply (400 jobs) all added jobs with only Clothing and Accessories (-700 jobs) shedding jobs.


Financial Activities added 7,600 jobs (4.1%) over the year. This is the fourteenth consecutive month of over-the-year gains above 4.0%. Financial Activities has not recorded an over-the-year loss since September 2010. Employment gains were recorded in Finance and Insurance (5,600 jobs) and Real Estate, Rental, and Leasing (2,000 jobs). Within Finance and Insurance, gains were recorded in Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (4,100 jobs), Securities, Commodity Contracts (1,000 jobs), and Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (500 jobs).

Professional and Business Services added 2,500 jobs (0.7%) over the year. Gains within Administrative, Support, and Waste (5,000 jobs) were offset by losses in Professional, Scientific and Technical Services (-1,700 jobs) and Management of Companies and Enterprises (-800 jobs). Within Administrative, Support and Waste, Business Support Services added 3,100 jobs (10.1%), Employment services added 1,600 jobs, and Services to Buildings and Dwellings lost 800 jobs.

Other Services added 1,700 jobs (1.9%) over the year. Other Services comprises of Repair and Maintenance, Personal and Laundry Services, Religious, Grant making, and Civic, Professional, and Similar Organizations.

Manufacturing added 900 jobs over the year. This gain ends nine consecutive months of over-the-year employment losses. All gains were recorded in Nondurable Goods (1,000 jobs), while Durable Goods lost 100 jobs. Within Durable Goods, Computer and Electronic Parts lost 1,600 jobs, Aerospace Products and Parts lost 1,200 jobs and Fabricated Metals remained flat.

Natural Resources and Mining added 100 jobs over the year.

Government shed 11,700 jobs (-2.8%), the largest over-the-year loss since July 2011. Losses were recorded in Local Government (-7,000 jobs), State Government (-3,600 jobs) and Federal Government (-1,100 jobs). Within State and Local Government, losses were primarily recorded within State Education (-4,300 jobs) and Local Education (-5,700 jobs) respectively.

Construction lost 900 jobs (-0.7%) over the year. This was the first over-the-year loss since June 2011. Gains within Heavy Construction (900 jobs) and Specialty Trades (300 jobs) were not enough to offset losses in Building Construction (-2,100 jobs).

Information lost 200 jobs over the year.

Summary

Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped one-tenth of a percent from 6.9% in April to 6.8% in May. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained unchanged at 6.3% in May. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0% and the U.S. rate was 7.5%.


Arizona lost 15,000 Nonfarm jobs (-0.6%) over the month in May. This loss was atypical for May in comparison to a flat post-recession ('10-'13) average. Losses were reported in both the Private Sector (-800 jobs, 0.0%) and Government (-14,200 jobs, -3.4%). Post-recession ('10-'13), the Private Sector has averaged a gain of 1,100 jobs. Although losses in Government are typical, May losses were much higher compared to the post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 1,100 jobs.

Six of the eleven major sectors added jobs, one was flat, and four reported losses over the month. Manufacturing added 1,600 jobs (1.0%), higher than the post-recession ('10-'13) average of 600 jobs. Other Services added 1,100 jobs, higher than the post-recession ('10-'13) average of 400 jobs. Leisure and Hospitality shed 1,500 jobs, slightly above the post-recession ('10-'13) average loss of 1,400 jobs. Construction lost 200 jobs compared to the post-recession ('10-'13) average gain of 1,000 jobs.


Over the year, Arizona added 31,000 Nonfarm jobs (1.2%), the lowest reported over-the-year growth since July 2010. The Private Sector accounted for all of the gains adding 42,700 jobs (2.0%) over the year in May. Government reported a loss of 11,700 jobs, with Federal, State, and Local Government all shedding jobs. Eight of the eleven major sectors added jobs and three reported losses over the year. Education and Health Services reported the largest gain of 13,800 jobs (3.7%). Sectors with relatively larger gains were: Leisure and Hospitality (8,700 jobs); Trade; Transportation and Utilities (8,500 jobs); Financial Activities (7,600 jobs); Sectors with relatively smaller gains were Professional and Business Services (2,500 jobs), Other Services (1,700 jobs), Manufacturing (900 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs), Government shed 11,700 jobs.


**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**







**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
