**Seasonal Gains in Retail Trade Dominates Nonfarm Job Gains;
Unemployment Rate drops to 7.8%**

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped four-tenths of a percentage point from 8.2% in October to 7.8% in November. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased three-tenths of a percentage point from 7.3% in October to 7.0% in November. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0% and the U.S. rate was 7.8% (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona added 25,900 Nonfarm jobs (1.0%) in November (see **Figure 2**), higher than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 20,800 jobs. The Private Sector accounted for nearly all Nonfarm job gains posting 25,500 jobs (1.2%). This gain was much higher than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 19,200 jobs. Government added 400 jobs (0.1%), less than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 1,600 jobs.






Over the Month by Industry Sector

Nine of the eleven major sectors added jobs and two were flat over the month (see **Figure 3**). Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained the most over the month and accounted for nearly 60% of all jobs added in November.

Trade, Transportation & Utilities (TTU) added 15,400 jobs (3.1%), the largest over-the-month gain ever recorded. The post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain for TTU is 11,900 jobs. The majority of gains were driven by seasonal gains in Retail Trade (12,500 jobs) in preparation for the upcoming holidays. The largest gains in Retail Trade were reported in General Merchandise (4,900 jobs) and Clothing and Accessories (2,600 jobs). Wholesale Trade added 1,000 jobs, only slightly above the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 800 jobs. Transportation and Warehousing added 1,800 jobs. This was the largest November gain and six times the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 300 jobs.

Many of the gains came from delivery services and were not captured in Air or Truck Transportation. Utilities added 100 jobs.

Financial Activities added 2,400 jobs, the largest November over-the-month gain on record. Finance and Insurance added 1,700 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (1,600 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (200 jobs). Credit Intermediation and Related Activities lost jobs (-100 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 700 jobs, larger than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 100 jobs.

Leisure & Hospitality added 1,900 jobs, less than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 2,600 jobs. Accommodation and Food Services added 2,700 jobs from Food Services and Drinking Places (1,900 jobs) and Accommodation (800 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation shed 800 jobs, in a month which averages ('09-'12) a gain of 600 jobs.

Education and Health Services (EHS) gained 1,800 jobs, only slightly below the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 2,200 jobs. Educational Services added 1,300 jobs. Social Assistance added 500 jobs, and Health Care was flat over the month.

Construction added 1,200 jobs, atypical for November, which has a post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) loss of 2,000 jobs. Specialty Trade gained 900 jobs, the first November gain since 2005 and more than the post-recessionary-average loss ('09-'12) of 1,600 jobs. Heavy Construction gained 900 jobs and Building Construction shed 600 jobs.

Other Services gained 1,100 jobs, higher than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 200 jobs.

Professional and Business Services gained 1,000 jobs, less than half the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 2,800 jobs. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 1,500 jobs, more than double the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 700 jobs. Management of Companies and Enterprises shed 100 jobs. Administrative and Support and Waste shed 400 jobs, the first November loss since 2008. The post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain for Administrative and Support and Waste is 2,100 jobs. Within Administrative and Support and Waste, Employment Services added 600 jobs, less than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 1,400 jobs. Business Support Services gained 300 jobs. Services to Buildings and Dwellings shed 1,200 jobs, higher than the average loss of 400 jobs.

Information added 700 jobs (1.8%). **Government** gained 400 jobs (0.1%). Local Government was the only subsector to gain jobs (800 jobs) with State (-100 jobs) and Federal Government (-300 jobs) shedding jobs. State Education (600 jobs) and Local Education (1,100 jobs) gained jobs within State and Local Government. **Manufacturing** was flat over the month with gains in Nondurable Goods (100 jobs)

being offset by Durable Goods (-100 jobs). **Natural Resources and Mining** was also flat over the month.

Over the Year

Arizona added 47,500 Nonfarm jobs (1.9%) over the year in November. All gains were from the Private Sector, which added 50,100 jobs (2.4%) over the year. Government reported a net loss of 2,600 jobs (0.6%) as both Federal (-1,400 jobs) and Local Government (-2,700 jobs) shed jobs. Nine of the eleven major sectors reported gains and two reported losses (see **Figure 4**).

Trade, Transportation and Utilities

reported the largest over-the-year gain of 11,000 jobs (2.2%). The majority of gains were in Trade (9,900 jobs) with both Wholesale Trade (5,200 jobs) and Retail Trade (4,700 jobs) posting gains. Within Retail Trade, Motor Vehicles and Parts reported a gain of 3,400 jobs followed by Food and Beverage (1,100 jobs), Building Material, Garden Supply (600 jobs), General Merchandise (400 jobs), and Furniture and Home Furnishings (300 jobs). Clothing and Accessories was the only subsector within Retail Trade to shed jobs (-2,100 jobs). Transportation and Warehousing added 1,300 jobs, while Utilities shed 200 jobs over the year.


Education and Health Services added 10,800 jobs (2.9%) over the year. Health Care (6,600 jobs), Social Assistance (2,000 jobs) and Educational Services (2,200 jobs) added jobs. Health Care job gains were from all three subsectors. Ambulatory Health Care Services (4,700 jobs), Hospitals (1,700 jobs) and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (200 jobs) added jobs.

Financial Activities added 9,600 jobs (5.4%), the largest over-the-year gain since June 2006. Finance and Insurance overall added 6,100 jobs with Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (3,400 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,600 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (1,100 jobs) all reporting gains. Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (3,500 jobs) reported the largest over-the-year gain since March 2006.

Leisure and Hospitality gained 7,900 jobs, primarily from Accommodation and Food Services (6,300 jobs). Gains in Food Services and Drinking Places (6,700 jobs) were offset slightly by losses in Accommodation (-400 jobs). Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation added 1,600 jobs.

Professional and Business Services added 5,700 jobs over the year. Administrative and Support and Waste added 4,000 jobs. Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services added 2,600 jobs while Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 900 jobs.

Construction gained 5,400 jobs (4.5%). Specialty Trades (6,400 jobs) and Heavy Construction (1,000 jobs) both added jobs while Building Construction lost 2,000 jobs.

Other Services (700 jobs), **Information** (500 jobs), and **Natural Resources and Mining** (100 jobs) all added jobs.

Government lost 2,600 jobs (-0.6%). State Government was the only subsector to add jobs (1,500 jobs), most of which came from State Education (1,300 jobs). Federal Government shed 1,400 jobs and Local Government shed 2,700 jobs, a third of which came from Local Education (-900 jobs).

Manufacturing shed 1,600 jobs over the year. Job gains in Nondurable Goods (1,100 jobs) were offset by losses in Durable Goods (-2,700 jobs).

Summary


The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona fell four-tenths of a percentage point from 8.2% in October to 7.8% in November. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased three-tenths of a percentage point from 7.3% in October to 7.0% in November. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0% and the U.S. rate was 7.8%. Arizona added 25,900 Nonfarm jobs (1.0%) in November, higher than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 20,800 jobs. The majority of Nonfarm employment gains came from the Private Sector which added 25,500 jobs (1.2%). The Private Sector job gain was higher than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 19,200 jobs. Although Government added 400 jobs, its gain was smaller than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 1,600 jobs. Nine of the eleven major sectors added jobs and two were flat over the month.

Over the month in November, Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) added the most jobs (15,400 jobs) accounting for nearly 60% of all jobs added this month. This gain was more than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 11,900 jobs and the largest over-the-month gain ever recorded. The majority of gains within TTU were seasonal and reported in Retail Trade which added 12,500 jobs. Financial Activities added 2,400 jobs, the largest November over-the-month gain on record. Leisure and Hospitality added 1,900 jobs and Education and Health Services gained 1,800 jobs. Construction added 1,200 jobs, unusual for November which has a post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) loss of 2,000 jobs. Other Services gained 1,100 jobs, higher than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of only 200 jobs. Professional and Business Services gained 1,000 jobs, less than half the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 2,800 jobs. Information and Government added 700 jobs and 400 jobs respectively. Manufacturing and Natural Resources and Mining were flat over the month.


In Arizona, 47,500 Nonfarm jobs (1.9%) were added to payrolls in November compared to the same time last year. The Private Sector accounted for all the gains adding 50,100 jobs (2.4%) over the year. Government reported a net loss of 2,600 jobs over the year. Nine of the eleven major sectors reported gains and two reported losses over the year. Trade, Transportation and Utilities reported the largest over-the-year gain of 11,000 jobs followed by Education and Health Services (10,800 jobs) and Financial Activities (9,600 jobs). Other major sectors which reported job gains include: Leisure and Hospitality (7,900 jobs), Professional and Business Services (5,700), Construction (5,400 jobs), Other Services (700 jobs), Information (500 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs). Both Government (-2,600 jobs) and Manufacturing (-1,600 jobs) shed jobs.


**Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate
Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change**






**Arizona & U.S. Construction Employment
