Unemployment Rate Unchanged at 6.8%; Above Average Gains in the Private Sector

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona remained unchanged in November at 6.8%. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also remained unchanged at 5.8% in November. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 7.8% and the U.S. rate was 7.0% (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona added 24,400 Nonfarm jobs (0.9%) in November (see **Figure 2**), higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 22,600 jobs and the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 19,200 jobs. The gains were primarily in the Private Sector (23,300 jobs). The Private Sector gain was also higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 21,100 jobs and the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 17,700 jobs. Gains in Government of 1,100 jobs were lower than the post-recession ('09-'13) and ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,500 jobs.




Over the Month by Industry Sector

Nine of the eleven major sectors added jobs and two shed jobs (see **Figure 3**).

Trade, Transportation and Utilities reported gains of 12,900 jobs, the highest of any sector. The gains were slightly above the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 12,700 jobs. November has historically been the strongest month for Trade with most gains in Retail Trade. Trade added 11,000 jobs, a gain slightly below the post-recession ('09-'13) average of 12,000 jobs. Wholesale Trade added 300 jobs and Retail Trade gained 10,700 jobs. Within Retail Trade, General Merchandise (5,200 jobs), Clothing and Accessories (3,200 jobs), Food and Beverage (500 jobs), Motor Vehicles and Parts (500 jobs), and Furniture and Home Furnishings (500 jobs) added jobs. Building Material, Garden Supply was flat over the month. The remaining 800 jobs were gained in unreported sectors. The gains in Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities (1,900

jobs) were all from unreported sectors within Transportation and Warehousing (1,900 jobs). Utilities was flat.

Professional and Business Services added 4,700 jobs. This was higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 2,900 jobs. Gains in Administrative and Support and Waste Services (4,100 jobs) were primarily from Employment Services (5,800 jobs) and a small gain from Services to Buildings and Dwellings (100 jobs). Business Support Services shed 300 jobs. The gain in Employment Services was the highest on record ('90-'14) and nearly three times the post-recession ('09-'13) average November gain of 2,100 jobs. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 900 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 300 jobs.



Other Services gained 2,000 jobs. This gain was the highest November gain on record ('90-'14) and five times the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 400 jobs.

Financial Activities added 2,000 jobs, double the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 1,000 jobs. Finance and Insurance added 1,000 jobs from Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (700 jobs), Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (200 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (100 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 1,000 jobs.

Education and Health Services added 1,500 jobs, below the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 2,200 jobs. Educational Services added 500 jobs. Gains in Health Care (600 jobs) were reported in Ambulatory Health Care Services (600 jobs) and Hospitals (600 jobs). Nursing and Residential Care Facilities shed 600 jobs. Social Assistance added 400 jobs.

Government added 1,100 jobs. Local Government (1,400 jobs) added jobs while State (-100 jobs) and Federal Government (-200 jobs) reported losses.

Leisure and Hospitality gained 900 jobs. The gain in Accommodation and Food Services of 1,700 jobs were slightly offset by losses in Arts, Entertainment and Recreation of 800 jobs. Food Services and Drinking Places gained 1,200 jobs and Accommodation gained 500 jobs.

Information added 300 jobs and **Natural Resources and Mining** gained 100 jobs. **Manufacturing** (-200 jobs) and **Construction** (-900 jobs) shed jobs.

Over the Year

Arizona added 66,900 Nonfarm jobs (2.6%) over the year. This was the second largest gain since 2006. The over-the-year Nonfarm job gain in October was revised upward from 66,400 jobs (2.6%) to 67,400 jobs (2.7%). The Private Sector reported a gain of 63,100 jobs (2.9%) and Government added 3,800 jobs (0.9%) over the year. Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains and one reported a loss (**Figure 4**).

Professional and Business Services gained 20,600 jobs over the year (5.5%). These gains were primarily in Administrative and Support and Waste Services which added 20,200 jobs, the largest gain since September 2005. Within Administrative and Support and Waste Services, Employment Services added 17,500 jobs, the highest over-the-year gain on record ('91-'14). The remaining jobs were added in Business Support Services (1,100 jobs) and Services to Buildings and Dwellings (800 jobs). Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 1,000 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises shed 600 jobs.

Education and Health Services added 18,100 jobs (4.7%) over the year. Educational Services added 1,600 jobs and Health Care and Social Assistance added 16,500 jobs. Health Care added 12,900 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (9,100 jobs), Hospitals (2,900 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (900 jobs). The gain in Ambulatory Health Care Services was the largest on record ('91-'14). Social Assistance added 3,600 jobs.


Leisure and Hospitality added 12,100 jobs over the year (4.4%). Accommodations and Food Services added 9,400 jobs. Food Services and Drinking Places added 8,600 jobs and Accommodations 800 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 2,700 jobs.

Financial Activities gained 5,700 jobs (3.0%) over the year. Finance and Insurance added 4,900 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (2,800 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,400 jobs), and Securities, and Commodities Contracts (700 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 800 jobs.

Trade, Transportation, and Utilities added 5,400 jobs (1.1%) over the year. All gains in Trade were from Retail Trade which added 3,700 jobs; Wholesale Trade shed 400 jobs. Within Retail Trade, Furniture and Home Furnishings (1,200 jobs), Food and Beverage (900 jobs), General Merchandise (900 jobs), Motor Vehicles and Parts (600 jobs), Clothing and Accessories (300 jobs) added jobs. Only Building Material, Garden Supply reported a loss (300 jobs). Transportation, Warehousing & Utilities added 2,100 jobs all from unreported sectors in Transportation and Warehousing (2,400 jobs). Utilities shed 300 jobs.

Other Services gained 4,500 jobs (5.1%) over the year.

Government added 3,800 jobs (0.9%) from State (2,300 jobs), Local (1,100 jobs) and Federal (400 jobs) Government over the year. This was the fourth consecutive month of over-the-year growth in Federal Government which reported over-the-year losses from January 2008 to July 2014.

Natural Resources and Mining (600 jobs), **Manufacturing** (300 jobs), and **Information** (100 jobs) also added jobs over the year.

Construction was the only sector that lost jobs (4,300 jobs, -3.5%). Only Heavy Construction added jobs (1,000 jobs) as Specialty Trade (-2,800 jobs) and Construction of Buildings (-2,500 jobs) lost jobs over the year.




Summary

Both, the U.S. and Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate remained unchanged in November at 6.8% and 5.8% respectively. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 7.8% and the U.S. rate was 7.0%. Over the month in November, Arizona added 24,400 Nonfarm jobs (0.9%). This gain was higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 22,600 jobs and the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 19,200 jobs. The majority of gains were reported in the Private Sector (23,300 jobs). These gains were larger than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 21,100 jobs and the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 17,700 jobs. Government added 1,100 jobs, lower than both the post-recession ('09-'13) and ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 1,500 jobs.

Nine of the eleven major sectors added jobs and two shed jobs. Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) added 12,900 jobs. November has historically seen strong gains in Trade overall, in particular Retail Trade (10,700 jobs), which was the primary driver of gains within TTU. The sectors that gained the most include Professional and Business Services (4,700 jobs), Other Services (2,000 jobs), Financial Activities (2,000 jobs), Education and Health Services (1,500 jobs), and Government (1,100 jobs). Relatively smaller gains were seen in Leisure and Hospitality (900 jobs), Information (300 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs). Manufacturing (-200 jobs) and Construction (-900 jobs) both shed jobs.

Arizona added 66,900 Nonfarm jobs (2.6%) over the year in November. This was the second largest gain on record since 2006 after October's upward revision from 66,400 jobs (2.6%) to 67,400 jobs (2.7%). Both the Private Sector (63,100 jobs, 2.9%) and Government (3,800 jobs, 0.9%) added jobs over the year. Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains and one shed jobs. Professional and Business Services had the most job gains (20,600 jobs) and highest percent gain (5.5%). These gains were primarily in Administrative and Support and Waste Services which added 20,200 jobs, the largest gain since September 2005. Other gains include Education and Health Services (18,100 jobs), Leisure and Hospitality (12,100 jobs), Financial Activities (5,700 jobs), Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (5,400 jobs), Other Services (4,500 jobs), and Government (3,800 jobs). Natural Resources and Mining (600 jobs), Manufacturing (300 jobs), and Information (100 jobs) had relatively smaller gains. Construction shed 4,300 jobs (-3.5%).


LABOR MARKET TRENDS CHARTS






**Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
