Job Gains Below Post-Recession Average in the Private Sector and Government

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped by one-tenth of a percentage point from 8.3% in September to 8.2% in October. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.2% in September to 7.3% in October. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.9%. (see **Figure 1**).

Arizona added 14,200 Nonfarm jobs (0.6%) in October (see **Figure 2**), slightly less than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 16,300 jobs. The majority of gains were in the Private Sector which added 11,000 jobs (0.5%). This gain was slightly below the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 13,500 jobs. Government added the remaining 3,200 jobs (0.8%), which was larger than the post-recessionary-average ('09-'12) gain of 2,800 jobs.



Over the Month by Industry Sector

Seven of the eleven major sectors added jobs, three recorded losses, and one was flat over the month (see **Figure 3**). Education and Health Services recorded the largest over-the-month gain (4,000 jobs), while Construction recorded the largest job loss (-2,500 jobs).

Education and Health Services (EHS) added 4,000 jobs in a month which historically ('03-'12) averages a gain of 2,700 jobs. The majority of these gains were reported in Educational Services which added 2,800 jobs. This is more than three times the average ('03-'12) gain of 900 jobs, and the highest recorded gain in the month of October. All gains within Health Care (200 jobs) were from Hospitals (500 jobs). Nursing and Residential Care Facilities shed 300 jobs and Ambulatory Health Care Services reported no change. Social Assistance added 1,000 jobs.

Professional and Business Services (PBS) gained 3,700 jobs (1.0%). Administrative and Support and Waste added 2,900 jobs, most of which occurred in Employment Services (3,300 jobs). The gain in Employment Services was the highest over-the-month gain since December 2011 and more than three times the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 900 jobs. Within Administrative and Support and Waste subsector, Services to Buildings and Dwellings added 1,000 jobs and Business Support Services lost 200 jobs. The subsectors of Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 700 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises added 100 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) added 3,600 jobs (0.7%), lower than the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 5,000 jobs. Trade added 4,300 jobs with both Retail Trade (4,000 jobs) and Wholesale Trade (300 jobs) reporting gains. In Retail, General Merchandise (1,400 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (700 jobs), Building Material (400 jobs), Food and Beverage (300 jobs), and Clothing and Accessories (200 jobs) reported gains. Motor Vehicles and Parts remained flat. Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities shed 700 jobs, falling short of the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 300 jobs.

Government gained 3,200 jobs (0.8%). State Government reported a gain of 2,300 jobs of which 1,400 jobs were from State Education. Local Government added 1,800 jobs, lower than the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 3,100 jobs. Above-average losses in non-education related sectors (-1,200 jobs) offset gains in Local Education (3,000 jobs).

Financial Activities added 2,200 jobs, the largest over-the-month gain since October 2010. Credit Intermediation and Related Activities added 1,300 jobs in a month which has a historic ('03-'12) average of zero job gains. This is the largest over-the-month gain in Credit Intermediation and Related Activities since April 2005. Securities, Commodity Contracts added 300 jobs while Insurance Carriers and Related Activities shed 100 jobs. Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 700 jobs.


Leisure & Hospitality added 500 jobs with gains in Accommodation and Food Services (1,000 jobs) being offset by Losses in Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (-500 jobs). **Other Services** gained 500 jobs.

Construction lost 2,500 jobs. Specialty Trade (-1,500 jobs), Construction of Buildings (-800 jobs), and Heavy Construction (-200 jobs) all reported losses.

Manufacturing and **Information** both shed 500 jobs over the month.

Natural Resources and Mining was flat over the month.



Over the Year

In October, total Nonfarm employment increased by 1.7% (43,200 jobs) over the same time last year. The Private Sector added 45,300 jobs over the year (2.2%), while Government lost 2,100 jobs (-0.5%). Nine of the eleven major sectors reported gains and two reported losses (see **Figure 4**).

Education and Health Services reported the largest over-the-year gain of 11,000 jobs (3.0%). Health Care & Social Assistance added 9,300 jobs, while Educational Services added 1,700 jobs. Within Health Care & Social Assistance, Health Care added 7,200 jobs primarily from Ambulatory Health Care Services (4,600 jobs). Nursing & Residential Care Facilities gained 1,000 jobs, and Hospitals gained 1,600 jobs. Social Assistance added the remaining 2,100 jobs.



Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 8,900 jobs (1.9%) over the year. Trade reported a gain of 9,600 jobs, while Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities shed 700 jobs. Wholesale Trade added 5,500 jobs while Retail Trade added 4,100 jobs. Gains within Retail Trade were recorded in Motor Vehicles and Parts (2,600 jobs), Food and Beverage (800 jobs), and Building Material, Garden Supply industries (600 jobs). These gains were offset by losses in Other General Merchandise Stores (-100 jobs). Transportation and Warehousing (-500 jobs) and Utilities (-200 jobs) both shed jobs over the year.

Financial Activities gained 8,700 jobs (4.9%), the largest gain since June 2006. Finance and Insurance added 5,800 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (2,800 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (2,100 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (900 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 2,900 jobs.

Professional and Business Services added 8,300 jobs (2.3%). Administrative and Support and Waste added 6,600 jobs, most of which came from Services to Buildings and Dwellings. Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services added 2,400 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 700 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality added 8,100 jobs. Gains were driven by Accommodation and Food Services (6,100 jobs). Food Services and Drinking places added 7,400 jobs, and Accommodation shed 1,300 jobs. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation added an additional 2,000 jobs.

Construction gained 500 jobs primarily from Specialty Trades (2,000 jobs). Construction of Buildings shed 1,500 jobs, the largest over-the-year loss since July 2010. **Information** added 900 jobs (3.4%), primarily from unreported sectors. **Other Services** added 300 jobs and **Natural Resources and Mining** added 100 jobs (0.8%).

Manufacturing recorded its third consecutive month of over-the-year job losses, shedding 1,500 jobs. Gains within Nondurable Goods (900 jobs) were offset by losses within Durable Goods (-2,400 jobs).

Losses within Durable Goods were recorded in Computer and Electronic Parts (-800 jobs), Aerospace Products and Parts (-200 jobs), and Fabricated Metals (-100 jobs) industries.

Government recorded the largest over-the-year loss, shedding 2,100 jobs. Local Government accounted for a majority of the losses (-2,500 jobs), with 700 of those job losses recorded in Local Education. Federal Government also recorded losses (-1,600 jobs), while State Government gained 2,000 jobs.

Summary

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona fell by one-tenth of a percentage point from 8.3% in September to 8.2% in October. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.2% in September to 7.3% in October. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.1% and the U.S. rate was 7.9%. Arizona added 14,200 Nonfarm jobs (0.6%) in October, slightly less than the post-recessionary-average gain of 16,300 jobs. The majority of gains were in the Private Sector which added 11,000 jobs (0.5%). This gain was slightly below the post-recessionary-average gain of 13,500 jobs. Government added the remaining 3,200 jobs (0.8%), which was larger than post-recessionary-average gain of 2,800 jobs. Seven of the eleven major sectors added jobs, three recorded losses, and one was flat over the month.

Education and Health Services (EHS) recorded the largest over-the-month gain (4,000 jobs), while Construction recorded the largest job loss (-2,500 jobs). The majority of gains within EHS were reported in Educational Services which added 2,800 jobs. Professional and Business Services (PBS) gained 3,700 jobs (1.0%). Within PBS, Administrative and Support and Waste added 2,900 jobs, most of which occurred in Employment Services (3,300 jobs). The gain in Employment Services was the highest over-the-month gain since December 2011 and more than three times the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 900 jobs. Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 3,600 jobs (0.7%), lower than the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 5,000 jobs. Trade added 4,300 jobs with Retail Trade (4,000 jobs) and Wholesale Trade (300 jobs), both reporting gains. Government gained 3,200 jobs (0.8%). State Government reported a gain of 2,300 jobs of which 1,400 jobs were from State Education. Local Government added 1,800 jobs, lower than the historic ('03-'12) average gain of 3,100 jobs. Financial Activities added 2,200 jobs, the largest over-the-month gain since October 2010. Leisure & Hospitality and Other Services both gained 500 jobs. Manufacturing lost 500 jobs with all the loss coming from Durable Goods (-700 jobs). Nondurable Goods added 200 jobs. Natural Resource and Mining remained unchanged over the month.

Over the year, total Nonfarm employment increased by 1.7% (43,200 jobs) in October. The Private Sector added 45,300 jobs compared to October last year (2.2%), while Government lost 2,100 jobs (-0.5%). Nine of the eleven major sectors reported gains and two reported losses. Education and Health Services added the largest number of jobs (11,000 jobs). It was followed by Trade, Transportation and Utilities (8,900 jobs), Financial Activities (8,700 jobs), Professional and Business Services (8,300 jobs), and Leisure and Hospitality (8,100 jobs). Small gains were also reported in Information (900 jobs), Construction (500 jobs), Other Services (300 jobs) and Natural Resources and Mining (100 jobs). Government recorded the largest over-the-year loss (-2,100 jobs), primarily in Local Government (-2,500 jobs). Manufacturing lost 1,500 jobs.

September Employment Report Summary

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona remained flat in September at 8.3%. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.3% in August to 7.2% in September. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.3% and the U.S. rate was 7.8% (see **Figure 5**).


In September, Arizona added 24,500 Nonfarm jobs (1.0%). This gain was slightly above the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 24,000 jobs, but below the post-recession-average ('10-'12) gain of 26,200 jobs. Government was responsible for the majority of Nonfarm job gains, adding 25,400 jobs (6.4%). This gain was more than both the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 21,600 and the post-recession-average ('10-'12) gain of 22,900 jobs. The Private Sector lost 900 jobs (-0.04%). Private Sector losses are atypical in a month that historically ('03-'12) has averaged gains of 2,400 jobs.




Four of the eleven major sectors gained jobs, five recorded losses and two remained unchanged (see **Figure 6**). Government reported the largest gain of 25,400 jobs (6.4%) in September. Gains were from Local (13,700 jobs) and State (11,800 jobs) Government, primarily in Local (15,800 jobs) and State (11,700 jobs) Education. Federal Government lost 100 jobs. Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 1,500 jobs (0.3%), which were primarily in Transportation and Warehousing (1,200 jobs). Leisure and Hospitality gained 200 jobs, well below its ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 2,100 jobs. Education and Health Services gained 200 jobs. Both, Manufacturing and Natural Resources and Mining remained flat. Information recorded the largest over-the-month job loss, shedding 1,200 jobs (-3.0%). Losses are typical for this sector in the month of September. Financial Activities lost 700 jobs (-0.4%); primarily from Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (-1,100 jobs). Construction (-400 jobs), Professional and Business Services (-300 jobs), and Other Services (-200 jobs) also recorded losses.

Arizona added 41,400 Nonfarm jobs (1.7%) over the year in September. All over-the-year gains came from the Private Sector which added 45,100 jobs (2.2%). Government shed 3,700 jobs, most of which came from losses in Local (-2,200 jobs) and Federal (-1,300 jobs) Government. Eight-of-the-eleven major sectors reported gains and three reported losses (see **Figure 7**). The largest gain occurred in Trade, Transportation and Utilities which reported an additional 10,200 jobs over the year (2.1%). Leisure and Hospitality gained 8,600 jobs (3.2%) marking the tenth consecutive month of growth above 3.0%. Education and Health Services added 7,500 jobs (2.0%), most of which came from Health Care (6,700 jobs). Other major sectors reporting gains include Professional and Business Services (7,100 jobs), Financial Activities (6,500 jobs), Construction (5,300 jobs), Information (1,300 jobs), and Natural Resources and Mining (200 jobs). Losses were in Government (-3,700 jobs), Other Services (-1,000 jobs), and Manufacturing (-600 jobs).



Over-the-Year Job Gain/Loss by Sector




Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate Seasonally Adjusted




Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change



Arizona & U.S. Construction Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change




Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment Year-to-Year Percent Change




**Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Employment Services
