Seasonal Gains in Government; Unemployment Rate Drops to 6.9%

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped two-tenths of a percentage point from 7.1% in August to 6.9% in September. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased two-tenths of a percentage point from 6.1% in August to 5.9% in September. This is the first time the U.S. unemployment rate has dropped below 6.0%, the lowest in over six years. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.0% and the U.S. rate was 7.2% (see **Figure 1**).


In September, 28,800 Nonfarm jobs (1.1%) were added to payrolls in Arizona (see **Figure 2**). The Nonfarm jobs gains were higher compared to the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 23,900 jobs and the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 22,900 jobs. Seasonal gains in Government (26,900 jobs) continued through September as schools returned to normal staffing levels.

Government accounted for the majority of the gains which were higher than the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 21,800 jobs. The Private Sector reported gains (1,900 jobs), slightly below the ten-year ('04-'13) average of 2,200 jobs, but higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) average of 700 jobs.

Over the Month by Industry Sector


Six of the eleven major sectors reported job gains, two reported no change, and three reported losses (see **Figure 3**).

Government added the most jobs (26,900 jobs, 6.8%). This gain was larger than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 22,200 jobs. The job gain was driven by Local (16,500 jobs) and State (11,900 jobs) Education. The gains in Local Education were lower than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 16,800 jobs and the gains in State Education were higher compared to the post-recession average (7,100 jobs). Non-Education related sectors reported a loss

in Local Government (-1,400 jobs). Federal Government lost 100 jobs.

Education and Health Services added 2,600 jobs (0.7%), the same as the average post-recession ('09-'13) gain for September (2,600 jobs). Health Care added 200 jobs and Social Assistance gained 1,200 jobs. The gains in Social Assistance were higher than the average post-recession ('09-'13) gain of 100 jobs. Educational Services added 1,200 jobs, less than the average post-recession ('09-'13) gain of 1,800 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality gained 1,100 jobs (0.4%), less than the average post-recession ('09-'13) gain of 1,800 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 800 jobs and Accommodation and Food Services gained 300 jobs. The gain in Food Services and Drinking Places was fewer than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain (1,600 jobs) and the weakest September report since 2009 (-900 jobs).



Professional and Business Services added 1,000 jobs (0.3%). This is more than the post-recession ('09-'13) average loss of 100 jobs. Administrative and Waste Services added 800 jobs, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 200 jobs, and Management of Companies and Enterprises was flat.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities gained 500 jobs (0.1%), higher than the average post-recession ('09-'13) loss of 900 jobs. Within Trade (900 jobs), Retail Trade added 1,200 jobs and Wholesale Trade shed 300 jobs. The gain in Retail Trade was the highest over-the-month gain since 2005. Food and Beverage (400 jobs), Furniture and Home Furnishings (300 jobs), Building Material, Garden Supply (100 jobs) and General Merchandise (100 jobs) added jobs. Clothing and Accessories and Motor Vehicles and Parts reported no over-the-month change.

Financial Activities gained 400 jobs. All gains came from Finance and Insurance (400 jobs) with Real Estate and Rental and Leasing reporting no change.

Two sectors, **Other Services** and **Natural Resources and Mining**, were flat over the month.

Construction shed the most jobs (2,900, -2.4%), more than the post-recession ('09-'13) average loss of 1,100 jobs. Specialty Trades lost 2,400 jobs, the highest over-the-month loss in September since 2009. While Specialty Trade job losses are not unusual, it is high relative to the average post-recession ('09-'13) job loss of 1,000 jobs. Construction of Buildings shed 400 jobs followed by Heavy Construction which shed 100 jobs.

Manufacturing (-500 jobs) and **Information** (-300 jobs) also shed jobs.

Over the Year

Arizona added 53,200 Nonfarm jobs (2.1%) over the year with the majority of job gains in the Private sector. The Private Sector gained 49,700 jobs, and Government added the remaining 3,500 jobs (0.8%). Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains with only one reporting a loss (see **Figure 4**).

Education and Health Services added the most jobs (17,200 jobs, 4.6%). Health Care and Social Assistance gained 14,700 jobs, the largest over-the-year gain since 2008. Health Care reported a gain of 10,000 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (6,400 jobs), Hospitals (2,500 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (1,100 jobs). Social Assistance added 4,700 jobs, the highest over-the-year gain on record ('91-'14). This follows the August gain of 3,700 jobs (after revision) which is now the second highest recorded gain in Social Assistance.

Professional and Business Services gained 14,400 jobs (3.9%). Nearly all of the jobs in this sector came from Administrative, and Support, and Waste Services which recorded a gain of 14,100 jobs, the highest since June 2008. Within Administrative and Waste Services, Employment Services (11,600 jobs), Business Support Services (1,600 jobs), and Services to Buildings and Dwellings (800 jobs) all gained jobs. The gain in Employment Services was the highest gain since September 2005. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services added 800 jobs and Management of Companies and Enterprises shed 500 jobs.

Leisure and Hospitality added 9,200 jobs (3.4%). Accommodation and Food Services added 6,000 jobs from Food Services and Drinking Places (5,700 jobs) and Accommodation (300 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation added 3,200 jobs.

Financial Activities gained 8,400 jobs (4.5%). Finance and Insurance added 7,200 jobs from Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (3,800 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (2,400 jobs), and Securities, Commodities Contracts (1,000 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 1,200 jobs.

Trade, Transportation, and Utilities added 5,400 jobs (1.1%). Trade gained 5,300 jobs from Retail Trade (4,600 jobs) and Wholesale Trade (700 jobs). Within Retail, Furniture and Home Furnishings (1,000 jobs), Food and Beverage (1,000 jobs), Motor Vehicles and Parts (700 jobs), and General Merchandise (700 jobs) added jobs. Building Material, Garden Supply reported no change and Clothing and Accessories shed 300 jobs. Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities added 100 jobs with losses in Utilities (-300 jobs) being offset by gains in Transportation and Warehousing (400 jobs).

Government added 3,500 jobs (0.8%). State Government gained 2,100 jobs, most of which



were from State Education (1,600 jobs). All gains in Local Government (1,300 jobs) were from Local Education (1,600 jobs). Federal Government added 100 jobs, the first recorded over-the-year gain in 44 months.

Other Services gained 2,300 jobs (2.7%).

Manufacturing added 400 jobs (0.3%). Nondurable Goods employment increased by 700 jobs while Durable Goods decreased by 300 jobs.

Natural Resources and Mining (400 jobs) and **Information** (300 jobs) added jobs.

Construction was the only major sector to record over-the-year losses (-8,300 jobs or -6.6%). This was the fifth consecutive month of over-the-year losses. Specialty Trade shed 5,100 jobs, the highest loss since October 2010. Construction of Buildings shed 3,900 jobs and Heavy and Civil added 700 jobs.





Summary

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona dropped two-tenths of a percentage point from 7.1% in August to 6.9% in September. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate also decreased two-tenths of a percentage point from 6.1% in August to 5.9% in September. In September, 28,800 Nonfarm jobs (1.1%) were added to Arizona payrolls. Job gains were predominantly in Government and were seasonal. Seasonal gains in Government (26,900 jobs) continued through September as schools returned to normal staffing levels. The gain in Government was higher than the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain of 21,800 jobs. The Private Sector reported gains (1,900 jobs) below the ten-year ('04-'13) average gain (2,200 jobs) but higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) gain (700 jobs).

Over the month, six of the eleven major sectors reported job gains, two reported no change, and three reported losses. Government recorded the largest over-the-month gain with 26,900 jobs added, fewer than the post-recession ('09-'13) average gain of 22,200 jobs. Gains in Government were driven by Local (16,500 jobs) and State (11,900 jobs) Education as schools returned to normal staffing levels. Education and Health Services added 2,600 jobs followed by Leisure and Hospitality (1,100 jobs), Professional and Business Services (1,000 jobs), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (500 jobs), and Financial Activities (400 jobs). Other Services and Natural Resources and Mining reported no over-the-month change. Construction shed the most jobs (2,900 jobs, -2.4%). This loss was higher than the post-recession ('09-'13) average loss of 1,100 jobs. Manufacturing (-500 jobs) and Information (-300 jobs) also shed jobs.




Arizona added 53,200 Nonfarm jobs (2.1%) over the year. The Private Sector added 49,700 jobs (2.4%) and Government added the remaining 3,500 jobs (0.8%). Ten of the eleven major sectors reported gains with only one reporting a loss. Education and Health Services reported the largest gain of 17,200 jobs. Gains were driven by Health Care and Social Assistance (14,700 jobs), which was the highest gain since May 2008. Other gaining sectors included Leisure and Hospitality (9,200 jobs), Financial Activities (8,400 jobs), Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (5,400 jobs), Government (3,500 jobs), Other Services (2,300 jobs), Manufacturing (400 jobs), Natural Resources and Mining (400 jobs), and Information (300 jobs). Construction was the only major sector to report over-the-year losses (-8,300 jobs), the fifth consecutive month of over-the-year losses.
